## A great year for Good Shepherd Centre

The Good Shepherd Centre, Church Lane, Kilkenny has been granted planning permission for two independent apartment blocks (one block containing eight apartments and the second block containing four apartments) by Kilkenny County Council.

The decision to grant planning comes after the voluntary body achieved its goal of building 80 new homes for the homeless in 2019, targeting families and single people through the Kilkenny Voluntary Housing Association.

It continues to provide housing first for people experiencing chronic homelessness while its hostel and short term emergency accommodation remains busy.

The planning permission for Church Lane includes the demolition of the existing single storey laundry room to the gable of existing Brother Thomas Place apartment block.

The works will also include the removal of an existing boundary wall and the construction of a new boundary fence (in an extended site area), all associated ancillary

accommodation, site works, drainage works and road works. The site is located within Saint Canice's Architectural Conservation Area.

### **GOALS FOR 2020** It has a number of focuses for

2020:

Find alternative funding streams

to purchase housing.

- Find additional new short term housing for homeless families to replace hotels
- Supports for people experiencing chronic homelessness. A new social enterprise focussing
- on Rehabilitation.

### Plan to make Vicar Street in city centre a one-way system

A plan to make Vicar Street, in the centre of the city, one-way would see only incoming traffic using the thoroughfare.

At present 5,362 vehicles use the two-way system daily with 3,110 going inwards and 2,252 going outwards.

The plan which will go public consultation once it is approved by the full council will improve traffic flow, allow for wider footpaths and provide a designated cycle lane going outwards.

It will also mean that large vehicles will no longer meet in the middle of the 150 metre long street, freeing up traffic.

The last meeting of the Kilkenny municipal district agreed to the blueprint after being told they had to stick to one of the four options put on the table by the executive. **TRICKY JUNCTION** 

The good news is that it will simplify traffic movements on what is already a tricky junction on to the new road leading to St Francis Abbey Bridge and to



Dean Street junction with Irishtown.

Mr Ian Gardner, Kilkenny City Engineer explained that the new lay-out would simplify traffic movements at the Vicar Street/Dean Street junction.

"It will allow the city bus service to utilise the existing bus bays on Greensbridge Street with pedestrians being able to safely board and alight at that bus bay," he said.

Disadvantages were that outbound traffic will no longer be able to turn on to Vicar Street and would have to use Greensbridge Street and St Francis Abbey Bridge with lead-on problems. It would also push more vehicles on to the Granges Road which is already heavy with traffic.

## New home in Hebron for National Reptile Zoo

Visitors are snapping up the chance to meet some of the new inhabitants of the National Reptile Zoo who recently moved to a state-of-the art premises at the Hebron Business Park.

James Hennessy, a keen conservationist runs the zoo and oversaw the renovation of the new premises which was constructed using mainly upcycled and recycled materials and is three times bigger than the original zoo.

It's new additions include the giant African Spurred Tortoise and there is also a nocturnal room which gives visitors a fresh insight into how the reptiles interact.

The building has a number of facilities including a multi media room, a nocturnal room, education rooms, a conference space, a shop and a cafe.

The impressive new zoo opened to the public last Friday and has received a hugely positive response to date. Previously the zoo had been located in Gowran.

For the past year James and his team have been busy building much larger habitats for their animals in this new, much larger location.

"We are looking forward to welcoming everyone to our new facility with lots of new and exciting elements.

"There has been an incredible reaction so far, people who have been to the facility in Gowran are very impressed with the size of the habitats and the extra room for visitors to look around.

The National Reptile Zoo is dedicated to the conservation of these amazing creatures and their habitats.

The zoo is open 10am to 6pm, seven days a week, year round, with over 50 exhibits, an Animal Encounter Zone, Nocturnal Realm, Media Room, Education Rooms, Coffee Shop, Souvenir Shop and Play Area, so the whole family can be entertained.

The zoo is also very involved in conservation work and educating members of the public regarding reptiles in the wild. This is done during the animal encounter sessions and of course by their resident reptiles, who are referred to as "Ambassadors for their species".

The team at the zoo continually gather data on their residents. This information is readily available to any interested researcher or institution that works in the conservation, science and education industry. The team also processes this information, adding to the existing knowledge about these animals, helping to fill in some of the blanks, building a better picture which helps us to help them in the wild.

The mission of the zoo is to inspire passion amongst the public about the lesser known species such as reptiles, amphibians, and invertebrates and to assist in the conservation of individual species and their habitats and to evoke a love of the natural world in people.

### WINDOW WONDERLAND (SUSTAINABILITY TRAIL)

Sustainability has been the theme running through this year's Yulefest Kilkenny festival. There's still time to explore the five city windows that have been transformed into magical storyboards through the use of recycled materials and take a walk in a window wonderland together in Kilkenny City. The window installations have been designed to encourage all ages to follow the journey to learn about the city and sustainability in a fun and engaging way.

A Yulefest Kilkenny creative collaboration, the installations were inspired by the animated work of four time Oscar® nominated Kilkenny based animation company Cartoon Saloon. Social enterprise ReCreate Ireland along with local artists guided the creation of the window display pieces with 600 pupils from primary schools across Kilkenny. Workshops began in schools in October (Reuse Month) and the children were given the opportunity to contribute to the story by creating baubles from reuse materials including plastics, foil, wool and fabrics in a series of workshops.

Take a 20-minute stroll, start at Kilkenny County Council Arts Office in Dean Street and finish in MacDonagh Junction Shopping Centre; this will take in all 5 windows and encourages passersby to explore the visual detail of the windows, to find objects they recognise and to discuss creative re-use and reduction of daily items. Free access but good luck passing by all those wonderful cafés en route and not buying a treat for the trail! Free.

### **SENSORY SENSITIVE QUIET TIME**

For some adults, children and families the bright lights and loud music of the season can cause stress and anxiety. At Yulefest Kilkenny, we believe that everyone should have an opportunity to experience and enjoy this beautiful city at Christmas time. So continuing the sensory sensitive visits until early January thanks to the support of Creative Ireland are Medieval Mile Museum, Kilkenny

on Ice and the Vintage Carousel, these venues will turn the lights and music down low when requested (or as scheduled), allowing the sensory sensitive person to experience the festive atmosphere in Kilkenny at a pace and in an environment that is comfortable for them to enjoy.

### **MAGIC TABLE**

Yulefest Kilkenny, with the support of Kilkenny Leader Partnership recently gifted a Magic Table to Kilkenny County Council Library Service. The Magic Table will rotate in time to different libraries across the County, its first installation is Loughboy Library, located at Loughboy Shopping Centre, Waterford Rd, Kilkenny.The Magic Table is an award-winning innovation from the Netherlands that is renowned for its cutting-edge approach to dementia care. The technology has been designed to help those at a later stage on their dementia journey to be more active and create moments of happiness. It consists of a series of interactive games that are projected on a table. The light games encourage players to reach out towards them and the lights subsequently respond to their hand and arm movements, allowing the residents to play with light, which is truly magical.

Paula Lawler, Festival Director of Yulefest Kilkenny which has brought The Magic Table to

Kilkenny through the Kilkenny County Council Library Service explains the rationale behind the project. "Throughout the Yulefest Kilkenny festival we have supported active retirement groups with attendance at our events and Kilkenny works hard on being an age friendly County. The Magic Table is designed to spark conversation and enhance memory for people with dementia and also autism. With the support of Kilkenny Leader Partnership funding we were able to work with Shift8\* to bring The Magic Table initiative to Kilkenny and we are happy to officially announce that The Magic Table is now installed in Loughboy Library in Kilkenny and is available for use there, with the support of the Kilkenny County Council Library Service." A 'Tovertafel', which translates

into English as 'Magic Table' is a Dutch innovation and creates a fun, safe environment for all players. The games are formulated with the intention to trigger a sense of reminiscence among players in order to encourage stimulation socially, cognitively and physically. As light simulations, games are projected onto a table and include gardening, fishing and popping balloons. The Magic Table also include games for people with autism, these games are described as being more directly educational.

Paula Lawler adds: "We wanted to bring in an element for the festival that would also include

our older audience with additional needs and enable people with Autism and their families to be able to access an interactive feature designed to engage and to spark fun. Already there have been groups in to enjoy The Magic Table in Loughboy Library and also enquiries from different community groups. A programming and engagement structure will commence in 2020 through Kilkenny County Council Library Service. This feature will have longevity Countywide after the festival is over as The Magic Table will rotate to other libraries around Kilkenny County in time, so Kilkenny City and County library service users and specific communities across the County can avail of the unique wellbeing benefits of The Magic Table all year round.

### Disappointment as Kilkenny Job Club will not reopen in new year

Kilkenny Job Club on Friary Street, Kilkenny will not reopen in the new year.

The Fr McGrath Family resource Centre, who run the service and was funded for two full-time positions, did not reapply for a contract to run the cub.

The project, which has been supporting job seekers within the county, has been managed by the Fr McGrath Centre since 2011 under contract to the Department of Employment Affairs and Social Protection (DEASP).

Stephen Murphy, Director of Services at Fr McGrath FRC said the decision was due to a strategic review of the FRC's core mission. "Reading the tea leaves on

government policy on contracted

employment services nationally, we have decided to call time on our involvement allowing us to focus on our core work with children and families who experience social challenges," he said.

"Over the years that we have supported Job Club and employed the core DEASP funded staff, the voluntary board of Fr McGrath FRC has accrued a redundancy liability of €14,000.

"Our voluntary management board find it deeply disappointing that the DEASP accepts no responsibility for this.


"This is a very significant amount of money for our

organisation and is one of the issues that, unfortunately, forced our hand as running for a further year would just have added to that obligation," he added.

He noted that the absence of any cost of living pay increase over eight years.

# Start the new year with some warming winter dishes

Christmas cooking can be a lot work. So start the new year with something tasty but easy to make!

I have some favourite, one pot, comforting recipes in the little binder where I stash all my go-to recipes. I don't feel like making them when the weather is warm. So when it gets a little bit chillier, in the middle of winter, making some of these feels like welcoming back an old friend.

It's not just the one-pot, stew-like nature of these dishes that qualifies them as 'warming' dishes for me, they are also full of warming spices. Nothing that will burn the mouth off you! But enough to relish.

And of course if you do like your dinners hot and spice you can add a bit more chilli, to suit your tastes.

This first dish is not a recipe, a friend once told me when I shared it with her, it's a 'thrown everything in a saucepan and cook.' It's that easy.

A quick note before you start - I make this recipe with Quorn chicken style pieces. It's the way I first discovered this recipe and actually the way I like it best, because I like the way the flavours are absorbed by the Quorn.

But I have also made this with mince, like a more traditional chilli, and it's lovely. Just brown the mince before adding the rest of the ingredients.

- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> teaspoon cayenne pepper
- <sup>1</sup>⁄<sub>4</sub> teaspoon turmeric
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 4 tablespoons chopped onions 140g / 50z finely chopped tomatoes
- 200g/70z red lentils
- <sup>3</sup>⁄<sub>4</sub> 1 teaspoon salt
- 3 tablespoons chopped fresh corriander

1 tablespoon butter (optional)

### METHOD

Combine the garlic, ginger, ground coriander, cumin, cayenne pepper and turmeric in a small bowl and mix.

Pour the oil into a wide, medium pan and set over a medium heat. When hot, put in the onions. Stir and fry until they turn golden at the edges. Add the spice mixture from the bowl. Stir for 1 minute. Add the tomatoes. Stir and cook, scraping the bottom, until the tomatoes have softened.

Now put in the lentils, 800mls / 28 floz of water and the salt. Bring to the boil. Cover partially, lower the heat and cook for 45 minutes. Stir in the fresh corriander (and butter if using) just before serving.

Serve over bulgar or couscous.

## SKODA predict a more optimistic

The total number of new cars sold in 2019 fell by 6.8% to 117,031 units compared to 2018. ŠKODA Ireland is projecting a slightly more optimistic result in 2020, with 120,000 passenger vehicle sales forecasted. Despite this year's decline there is still a very healthy appetite for vehicles with 12.9% more used car imports registered in 2019 compared to 2018.

The biggest challenge for the industry over the last 3 years was the staggering 307,900 used imports that indirectly affected the new car market. With the introduction of the new government NOx tax from 1st January; used imports will not be as advantageous as was previous. Take for example: a 2016 ŠKODA Superb 2.0 TDI 4x4 170bhp; regardless of purchase price and excluding currency fluctuations this vehicle is subject to a further €2,400 NOx Tax in addition to Vehicle Registration Tax (VRT)! This is likely to increase the cost significantly of importing a used vehicle.



In the last 12 months the sale of electric vehicles has increased nearly threefold! 3,443 Battery Electric Vehicles (BEVs) were delivered in 2019 compared to 1,233 in the same period last year. The demand for BEVs will only increase in line with consumer awareness of climate change and new model introductions from various brands. Diesel powered vehicles accounted for 47% of all vehicle sales in 2019 with 54,505 customers opting for Diesel in 2019. With electric vehicle technology, especially battery range and infrastructure still in development; petrol and Diesel vehicles will likely account for 85% of new vehicle sales in 2020.

Plug in Hybrid Vehicles (PHEVs) are seen as a stepping stone to an electric future and provide the best of both worlds, with the ability to drive on pure electric power in isolation - or in combination with a modern petrol engine. PHEVs have seen significant growth in the last 12 months with 1,343 vehicles delivered in 2019, an increase of 85% on the same period last year. ŠKODA Ireland are predicting further PHEV sales growth in 2020 with 250 deliveries alone planned of their new Superb iV PHEV.

Automatic transmissions were once exclusive to premium vehicles but are now becoming much more prevalent in the Irish market. Between 2016 and 2019 automatic vehicle sales have grown by 55% to 38,705 units last year. One in three new cars sold in 2019 was an automatic. This growth can be attributed to changing customer behaviour and improved transmission technologies such as the efficient 7-speed DSG automatics offered in ŠKODA vehicles.

Colour trends have changed little in the last 12 months. The most popular vehicle colour of 2019 by a considerable margin was grey (43,495) followed by

black (21,010). Colour trends have changed over time however!

White, for example remains a very popular colour, with 17,353 vehicles delivered in 2019 - an incredible 2,205% increase compared to a decade ago when only 753 customers purchased a white vehicle in 2009!



2.01pm. Holders Man City top the betting market at odds of 13/5, with Liverpool next best at 6/1. However, preference is for 7/1





Three sides will start into 2020 with silverware on their minds as  $they \, chase \, coveted \, places \, in \, the \, club$ All-Ireland finals.

On Saturday Conahy Shamrocks face a trip to Monaghan for a meeting with Derry outfit Eoghan Rua.

Conahy know what it takes to reach the promised land of Croke Park. They scaled the heights in 2008, going all the way as they beat Moyle Rovers of Tipperary to claim the All-Ireland crown.

Their path has been a little different this time around. While they lost the county final they went in Leinster as Kilkenny's representatives. They shrugged off that disappointment in impressive

Tullaroan, For the championship is uncharted territory but they have been game explorers. While the key to 2019 was regaining their senior hurling status they have enjoyed the adventure and the challenge Leinster championship has brought, something they showed to devastating effect when they easily

accounted for Offaly's Seir Kieran in the Leinster final.

Both Conahy and Tullaroan will be hoping to keep Kilkenny's proud record of reaching finals going. Since the competitions were established the county has won eight junior titles and six at intermediate grade.

The attention switches to the


