



## Kilkenny tops IBAL litter survey for fourth time

Kilkenny has once again been deemed cleanest of 40 towns and cities surveyed by business group Irish Business Against Litter (IBAL).

The Marble City is once again top of the IBAL litter rankings for a record fourth time, having last won in 2014.

Among the areas in Kilkenny to come in for praise were the Clara approach road, High Street, Market Cross, MacDonagh Junction Train Station, the Gowran approach road, and the N10 — M9 connecting road to Carlow.

The banks of the River Nore were deemed 'wonderful' — "a lovely riverside environment with 'olde' style street lamps" —and there was no litter observed in the water.

Areas flagged as potential problems include an abandoned/closed building at Parliament Street, and the recycling facility at St Canice's — reportedly 'let down by loose litter items to the rear'.

"Kilkenny reclaims its position at the very top of the league – a superb achievement for such a popular bustling centre," says the An Taisce report.

Minister for Communications, Climate Action and Environment, Richard Bruton was among those to congratulate Kilkenny topping the charts.


Meanwhile, Cathaoirleach of Kilkenny County Council, Peter 'Chap' Cleere described the result as another fantastic achievement for Kilkenny, adding to its numerous achievements on the national stage.

"These awards cannot be achieved without the ongoing investment of Kilkenny County Council in keeping Kilkenny City clean and litter free," he said.

"The result is also a huge tribute to the work of the Kilkenny City Area staff who work tirelessly everyday to ensure the citizens of Kilkenny City wake up every morning to a clean and litter free city."

Mayor of Kilkenny Martin Brett also expressed his delight on Kilkenny's achievement.

"This is a wonderful achievement for Kilkenny City and I would like to acknowledge the contribution of voluntary groups in the city such as Keep Kilkenny Beautiful committee and Kilkenny Sub Aqua and the council." he said.

## Bright minds set off for the Young Scientist Exhibition

Dozens of students from local schools headed to the RDS in Dublin yesterday (Wednesday) to take part in the finals of the 2020 BT Young Scientist and Technology Exhibition.

Taoiseach Leo Varadkar is among the guests of honour as the competition officially gets under way. The awards take place on Friday at 5.30pm.

Among the local students who made the journey are a group from Castlecomer Community School (right) who have investigated 'The Prevalence of the Myth of Twins Skipping a Generation in our Community'.

Another project, by a group of girls from Loreto Secondary School, looks at the effect of terroir on the taste of whiskey.

Seven projects are included from the Granges Road school.

Castlecomer Community School, St Kieran's College, CBS Kilkenny and Coláiste Pobail Osraí also have projects in the running.

#### EFFECTS OF IPADS

CBS Kilkenny have four projects. One looks at 'the minimum amount of time to wait before allowing schoolchildren to retrieve items from a car boot', while another investigates the effect of iPads on academic success.

The other entries are 'Quick Shop' and 'Is greyhound racing ethical?'

Coláiste Pobail Osraí have four projects in the finals, in the



biological and ecological, and technology categories.

Another team from Loreto is asking 'Is there a place for older people on social media and smartphone applications?' while a

group from the same school ask 'Which colour are teenagers most drawn to?'

#### TWINS STUDY

A group from Castlecomer Community School has entered a study into the prevalence of twins skipping a generation in the community.

In the chemical, physical and mathematical science category a group from Loreto have a project Katelyn O'Brien, Abby Marnell and Abbey Lalor interviewing twins Kayla and Saidbh O'Connor and Darragh and Donal Coughlin as part of their BT Young Scientist project on 'The Prevalence of the Myth of Twins Skipping a Generation in our Community'

'Exploring fractals', while another project from that school looks at tackling climate change through plastic.

#### COMPARATIVE STUDY

A St Kieran's College team have produced a statistical and comparative study to predict the outcome of senior inter-county championship and senior schools hurling matches.

Another group from the same school examined common injuries among adolescents in the GAA compared to other sports. A third group from St Kieran's asks if organic food really is better for the environment.

In total, over 1,100 students are involved in the 550 finalist projects at the competition.

The students have been meticulously preparing to exhibit their projects and meet the judges this week.

Last year's winner was Adam Kelly from Skerries Community College with his project 'Optimising the simulation of general quantum circuits'.

This is the 56th year of the competition which has seen some fantastic projects entered over the years. Best of luck to all!



## How to get ready for the mocks

he mocks are on the way so you are starting to feel some pressure.

That's both natural and ok. Here are some ideas in no particular order of importance.

#### **GENERAL IDEAS**

- 1. The mocks are NOT the most important exam you will ever do; no one remembers what they got in the mocks. The mocks are there for you to see where you are at in a moment of time. There is a long way to go before the real deal and a lot of work can be done. That said it is natural that you may feel under a little more pressure so don't be afraid to say so to someone you trust.
- 2. Exercise should be a vital part of your routine from now on. It does not have to be a 5 hour session in the gym but a brisk 30 minute walk will clear the brain and help more with study
- 3. Don't cheat. There are only a few mock exams per subject. It is easy enough to get information about what is on like which poet or which theorem but that is a waste for you. You must trust yourself and the work you have done. You do not have to get a H1 or an A in the mocks.
- 4. Study over the next few weeks is not just about quantity but about quality. Make sure you have a study area that works for you. Start with the subject you like the least and leave a subject you like to study till last. If you are getting bored then change subjects. On a break go for a small walk even around the room just to get the blood flowing.
- 5. You must make use of the weekends to do the extra revision. It is hard to do extra during the week as you have to keep up with school work but at the weekends you can divide your time up to cover the most important topics or the topics that get the biggest marks.

So in summary don't get stressed, don't over study, find out the important topics, don't cheat and do your best. When the mocks are over that's when you really need to start your revision for the big one.

You need to realise that this is not a house exam that has only a few topics on it.

The whole course must be revised. This is not an easy or a quick task at any level. You must start your revision now.

#### WHAT ARE MOCK FOR?

The mocks are there to show you



 $two\,things\,as\,far\,as\,I\,am\,concerned.$ 

#### How poor your revision is. How poor you do exams.

Did you start your revision early enough? Probably not. Now you realise how much there is to do once the mock are over make a plan of which topics you will get revised on which week before the real exams start.

It is so much harder to concentrate in exams that can be anywhere from 2 hours to 3 hours 30 minutes long. It is very hard work.

Other issues that you will face include not having the course done

in school. For the mocks there is nothing that you can do about that. A lot of courses are very long and hard for teachers to get through. I would not worry about what you have not done so put that aside and work on what has being done.

I would for sure ask your teacher when the course will be finished because good revision is vital. If you are unlikely to get revision done in school then you must do it yourself either on your own or get extra help outside school.

#### TOPICS TO COVER

Some students are not sure what topics are on which paper. Ask your

teacher for a detailed breakdown of the course.

You need to know how many sections are on each paper and the marks that awarded for each one.

You need to know the time that you should spend at each question.

You need to know the marks that go for each question and what the marks are awarded for.

One thing I could not recommend highly enough is a visit to ww.examination.ie. Go to examinations material archive, hit

on Chief Examinations reports. Pick your subjects and they have a section called 'What can current and future students and teachers learn from this? Or in older reports it is 'Recommendations for teacher and students'. This is the examiners giving you advice. Read it and take it

#### **EXAM TIPS**

Do not go over time even if the question is not fully finished. It is vital that you get to the last question.

The answer is in the question. Read the question before you start carefully. Underline what you think are the important parts. Do not underline every single bit just the key words.

When you get stuck (note I said 'when' not 'if') read the question. The answer is there in front of you. If you cannot see what is going on put a red star beside the question and move on. A red start means that you have no real idea what to do so do not waste time feeling sorry for yourself.

I have had students in the past who will say that they hit the panic button and once they do the red mist descends and they cannot see anything.

It will happen somewhere in

some exam. Stop look around even have a sweet. Go the toilet. Have a little chat with yourself along the lines of – 'this is only the mocks. I knew this was going to happen. It does not matter. I will not allow this to happen in the real thing'.


When the chat and panic is over turn the page and find a nice question that you can do and you're off again.

#### SILLY MISTAKES

There are silly mistakes that people make that cost marks.

- 1. Sign mistakes. It is so easy to make a silly sign mistake either when doing a calculation or when you have to change the sign of a line and you forget one term.
- 2. Units. You must put in the right units when doing questions on length, area and volume or when it is speed-distance time.
- 3. Decimal place. If asked to round to one decimal place then do so correctly. Read the question.

My last thing to say to you is that the mocks are the mocks they show you where you are at a moment on time. They are for you to see where your revision is at take your time and try your best.



And what a tasty way to try that! Here are the latest (and yummiest) superfoods to help you on your way to a future-friendly lifestyle, as recommended by top pharmacist and medical nutritionist Aidan Goggins. Aidan is author of The Health Delusion and nutritional consultant to athletes including: Team Ineos UK (professional cycling); Conor Mc Gregor and David Haye.

#### **WAKAME SEAWEED**

This leafy green from the sea is delicious in cold salads or as a garnish for rice, soups, fish or tofu, with a deep and satisfying umami flavour. It's also a rich source of iodine, and most of us in this part of the world, especially young women and vegans, are deficient in this vital nutrient that keeps our thyroid healthy and metabolism ticking over.

#### **PURPLE POTATOES**

Give your mash an eye-popping purple twist. Beautiful in any dish, the striking violet shade of this prince of potatoes may not bring a dramatic flavour difference, but its powerful pigment is packed with

#### KEFIR

The new must-have recovery drink for athletes, kefir is a rich protein source while promoting intestinal health and immunity, which can become strained after strenuous exercise. A fermented milk drink similar to a thin yoghurt, kefir has an enjoyable tart-sour tang and a bit of a natural fizz. It's traditionally made from cow's milk

but these days you'll find kefir to suit all audiences, with dairy-free alternative milks like coconut, rice and soy available too.

#### **POPCORN**

#### **BROCCOLI SPROUTS**

Little broccoli, big benefits. Easy to eat in everything from salsas to smoothies, broccoli sprouts contain up to 50 times more of the powerful nutrient sulforaphane than mature broccoli heads, with lots of crunchy texture and a radish-like peppery taste. A recent study found daily broccoli sprouts lowered blood sugar in diabetics by 10% more than medicine alone.

#### JERUSALEM ARTICHOKE

A super-rich source of the prebiotic inulin, which increases good bacteria in the gut. A fascinating 2019 study found that individuals who eat inulin-rich vegetables even experience diet behaviour changes, reporting greater satisfaction and a drive to eat a healthier diet. ## **Storage Solutions** for your Christmas Decorations

I hope everyone had an amazing Christmas and that you enjoyed all the festive celebrations. It's now time to start thinking about where and how to store all your Christmas decorations. Every year we tell ourselves we won't purchase anymore decorations, but it can be very hard to resist and there is often a lot more decorations to put away than we initially anticipated. Here are some helpful Tips on how to best to pack and store your decorations. Hopefully these should help make decorating next year a little easier too.

#### Recycle your Tree

Dispose of any sets of lights that are no longer working. Christmas tree recycling is available through Kildare County Council at many locations throughout Kildare. Christmas trees can be left for recycling at the following locations from Saturday, 4 January to Saturday, 18 January 2020: \*Ardclough community Centre \*Athy, Meeting Lane \*Clane, GAA Club \*Maynooth, Council Depot,

Barrett Park, Canal Road (open to the public on Saturday, 4 and Saturday, 11 January only)

www.kildarechristmastrees.ie offer a post-Christmas tree collection and recycling service for €10.00 where they will collect your Christmas tree after Christmas saving you the hassle of transporting it and cleaning up the pine needles from your car.

When taking decorations you may decide that some no longer suit your scheme, so you might want to dispose of any that you no longer want. Consider any unbroken

decorations to charity.

#### **Storing Baubles**

Depending on the size of tree and the number of trees you could either store your baubles in storage boxes with dividers or you could opt for a larger storage solution such as a large laundry basket to allow you to keep garlands and baubles for the one room in the same storage basket.

For glass baubles or valued tree decorations consider using bubble wrap or tissue to individually wrap and protect them. Avoid newspaper as the ink can stain your decorations. For smaller ornaments you can consider using clean dry egg cartons. Remember to label your boxes and store in a cool dry place.

Storing Lights
If you dislike having to untangle lights each Christmas, then this easy tip is the one for you. The easiest way is to wrap you lights around something as you take them down e.g. a circular tube like a pringle can or some cardboard etc. You can then store them in a box or plastic bag to protect them from dust to ensure they work perfectly for next year.

Storing your Christmas Tree
For artificial Christmas trees I would suggest that you use a tree storage bag. Ensure you fold in all branches as per the design of your tree to avoid any warping of your trees shape. If you want to make things easy for next year and have sufficient room for storing your tree in one piece, then you could opt to keep your lights on your tree and wrap your tree carefully with cling film.

#### For Wreaths and Garlands

Wreaths can be an expensive investment so make sure you either store them in the box they came in or opt for a wreath storage bag ensuring the bag is larger than the wreath to avoid any damage. You could also use a

garment bag with a coat hanger to hang your wreaths or garland. Ensure you label the bag with its location e.g. hall door, over mantle etc.

Storing Gift Wrap
For storing rolls of gift
wrap you could consider a clear clothes cover or a clear box as this will allow you to easily see what gift wrap you have. If using a clear storage box, you could also add some compartments for sellotape, ribbon, etc so you have everything you need in the one area.

If you would like some help with your Christmas decorating next taking consider some photographs of your trees, table tops and mantle before take down your decorations and then share these picture with your family next year, so they can use them as a guideline to help you.

Identify Your Own

A SMART goal is Specific, Measureable, Achievable, Realistic and Time limited.

#### **Top Tips**

#### For Helping your Teen Stay Healthy

#### Provide Lots of Healthy Food and Snacks.

Many teenagers have voracious appetites-it may feel like a full time job keeping them fed. If you have lots of filling, healthy snacks on hand (think fruit, cut up vegetables, hummus and pita, wholegrain bagels and peanut butter, wholegrain pasta with tomato sauce), they will be more likely to reach for these than fill up on junk

#### Get Active Together.

If your teens see you leading a healthy, active lifestyle, they will be more likely to follow suit. Ask your teen to join you on an evening walk—they might surprise you and actually come, and this can be a great way to connect

#### **Communicate and Share** Information.

Many parents find it challenging to discuss some issues, such as sex and drug and alcohol misuse, with their teens. The reality is that teens who can communicate openly and honestly with their parents about these issues tend to make better, healthier choices. So, get in the habit of talking about these issues openly and honestly.

#### **Help Them Build** Resilience.

Teenagers are under a lot of pressure from school, friends, social media, etc., and many teenagers are struggling with mental health issues such as anxiety and depression. Developing positive coping strategies can help teenagers manage these pressures and improve their overall well-being. Explore things like exercise, diet, meditation, yoga, breathing, mindfulness, etc. with your child and help them find a strategy that works for them.

## Sometimes you need to press the pause button

Do you ever find yourself on the way to collect the children from school or driving home from work with the endless tick, tick, tick of your endless to do list churning through your mind—what you need to do, what you need to get, where you need to be churning over in your

Have you ever found yourself trying to make it through the list before you can finally, finally sit down and relax for a few minutes? And, then, well, it's time to get to

Parenting requires us to multi-task like we have never multi-tasked before sometimes, it can become all about getting things done rather than enjoying what we are doing.

Many parenting guides use some variation on the idea of "Pressing the Pause" button. This means when we find ourselves reacting to our children with anger, frustration or simple exhaustion, that we take a moment before we respond. This might mean just taking a few deep breaths; it might mean walking in to another room for a few minutes; or, if emotions are running really high, it might mean deciding to address the issue at a later time or date.

It involves acknowledging our own emotions, taking the time to think about how we are feeling and recognising that reacting in anger or frustration won't help us or our child. Taking this time allows us to calm down and react with the love and patience that we and our children need.

This idea can be applied to many situations—not just when your teenager comes home later again or when your toddler hops out of bed for the 15th time in a row. It can be useful when that list starts to tick, tick, in your mind on your way to collect the children. Instead of thinking; "We need to get to soccer, then to music class, ugh, I forgot to bring the raffle tickets, what will we make for dinner, the kitchen is a disaster, lunches need to be done. where is that Irish book...", press the pause button, take a few deep breaths and stay in the moment. Let yourself find a moment of enjoyment—if you're in the car alone, put on your favourite music. If you're with the kids, find a crowd-pleaser and all belt along.

If you're trying to get the dinner ready, while making lunches and keeping little ones happy and entertained while underfoot, and the chaos threatens to become overwhelming, try pressing the pause button. Give yourself a moment, acknowledge that this is a lot to manage and let yourself relax. Think about something positive in

the moment--share a joke with the children, give them a hug, savour what you are cooking...whatever you need to do to make this moment enjoyable.

That list will still be there, and there will still be moments when everyone flies out the door with breakfast half eaten and books forgotten.

Giving yourself time to pause, to enjoy this moment rather than worrying about all the moments to come, however, can make a big difference in how everyone in the family reacts to stress and let you all enjoy your time together.

## Eating well to help get back on track

## GLE shakes up SUV market

**Sleek:** Coupe blends sportiness and elegance with engineering of large premium SUV

Mercedes-Benz will introduce some 22 new models on to the Irish market in the coming year.

The German carmaker has unveiled one model that will be amongst its new arrivals - a new GLE Coupe introduction whose accompanied ultra-sporty stablemate, a Mercedes-AMG GLE 53 4MATIC + version.

Currently accounting for around one-third Mercedes-Benz sales, SUVs are of increasing importance to them with a global customer base of over six million owners spread across an eight model range that includes GLA, GLB, GLC, GLC Coupe, GLE, GLE Coupe, GLS and the G-Class itself.

Coming to Ireland early

next year, the GLE Coupe blends the sportiness and elegance of a coupe with the engineering of premium SUV. a large

The car is now longer and wider than before with a wheelbase 20mm greater.

Muscular where it needs to be, the GLE Coupe has a powerful appearance accentuated by contoured body lines. It sports the familiar diamond radiator grille with single horizontal Louvre and featuring technol headlamps full-LED technology as standard.

Inside it shares many common features with other models in the brand's new premium-SUV family. A strikingly shaped instrument panel - the upper surface is covered in man-made leather as standard - and two large 12.3-inch/31.2cm screens that seamlessly flow into the door

Sports seats are standard as in a new sports steering wheel. It also has the latest generation 'Mercedes me' and MBUX infotainment system with voice control features and a range of comfort options and apps.

The four-door coupe offers more room than its predecessorwith comfortable space for five adults. Its entrance dimension has been enlarged

by 35mm and its interior stowage space increased to 40 litres. All-round visibility has also been improved.

At 655 litres, boot space is very generous with folding rear seats that increase it to a best-in-segment capacity of 1790 litres, around 70 litres more than before. Its loading sill is higher than on conventional SUVs.

At launch, two powerful six-cylinder diesel engines will be available - a 350d 272hp with 600Nm torque, and a 400d 330hp with a huge 700Nm torque. Combined fuel consumption is 8.0-7.5 litres/100km and combined emissions 212-197g/km. A 300d will follow at a later date.

Petrol version available at launch will be Mercedes-AMG GLE the 4MATIC+ Coupe combined fuel consumption

of 9.3 L/100km and Co2 emissions of 212g/km. Preparations are also under way for a 350de plug-in-hybrid version. In both models, engines comply with Euro 6d standard. Transmission is 9G TRONIC automatic in both cases. The new GLE Coupe

comes with a host of optional extras, comfort elements, vehicle safety and driver assistance features in what Ciaran Allen, sales manager Mercedes-Benz for passenger cars in Ireland says: 'is a model that matches the emotive appeal of a sporty and elegant coupe to the imposing power of an off-road vehicle'.

The focus in Ireland is expected to be the 350d model. Prices and specifications will announced closer to launch but 'will be competitive'.

#### Latest generation Golf on the way this March

Volkswagen's new generation Golf has been awarded a top five-star rating in the EuroNCAP crash test programme, writes Trish Whelan.

The Golf scored 95pc for adult occupant protection, 89pc for child protection and 76pc for pedestrian and cyclist protection.

For the first time in the model the car has standard Lane Assist and Front Assist. The car brakes automatically in dangerous situations - even at very low speeds in the city and now includes Cyclist Monitoring, swerve support and a braking when turning function.

The EuroNCAP rating gave the Golf a 78pc score in the Safety Assist category.

In Ireland, one in five 'A' segment hatchbacks on our roads is a Golf. The Ireland trim for the new Golf 8 will be: Golf, Life, Style, R-Line. Eight versions will be available but the key engine for Ireland is expected to be the 1.0 TSI 110hp Evo; the key diesel will be the 2.0 TDI with 115hp.

This latest Golf will arrive here in March 2020.

#### All-electric Opel coming

Opel's 201 offers are now available at all Opel dealers nationwide, writes Trish Whelan.

The German manufacturer is set to launch its first all-electric vehicle, the Corsa e, and its first Hybrid PHEV engine in the Grandland X Hybrid 4.

Opel has dramatically increased engine efficiency in other models in its range such as the Astra.

Corsa is available at 3.9pc APR on both PCP and Hire purchase agreements. The Insignia is offered at 3.9pc on PCP and opc on hire purchase agreements. Astra, Crossland X and Grandland X models are all available with opc APR on both PCP and hire purchase agreements with a €3,000 scrappage allowance.

Opel hopes to build it 7.7pc market share for its LCV range in 2020. The Opel Combo Cargo, (Ireland's shared Van of the Year award 2020) is available at opc APR on hire purchase agreements with a €3,000 scrappage allowance and a 5-year warranty as is the medium sized Vivaro van and the largest van in the Opel range, Movano but it gets a €5,000 scrappage allowance.

### 70% plan to buy an electric or hybrid car

### **Carzone:** report examines trend in motoring market

Irish motorists do not feel confident when selecting car finance options with a quarter (24%) feeling they don't have a good understanding of the different car finance options available, according to the latest Motoring Report from Carzone, Ireland's trusted motoring marketplace.

The Carzone Motoring Report is compiled by analysing data from the 80 million+ car views carried out on Carzone in 2019, as well as an in-depth survey of over 1,500 Irish drivers.

#### BUYING AND FINANCING A

According to the Carzone Motoring Report, 39% of respondents intend to buy a car in the next year and nearly a third (31%) change their car every two to three years. The main reasons for purchasing a car is simply wanting a newer car (30%), the need for a more reliable car (21%) or they require a larger car for a growing family (16%).

It is clear from the data that Irish drivers are unsure when it comes to car finance, and the research highlights the perceived barriers to using car finance for motorists.

Over half (55%) of drivers are concerned about getting into debt, 44% are sceptical about the lump sum required at the end of a PCP agreement and 40% don't like the idea of not owning the car outright when buying via PCP and hire purchase.

Using personal savings is the first option considered by car buyers when looking at financing a car (48%) followed by a bank loan (41%), Credit Union loan (34%), hire purchase (16%) and PCP (14%). Browsing online (90%) is the most popular way of researching car finance, followed by enquiring with a dealer (45%) and getting recommendations from friends and family (25%).

While most cars are still purchased in dealerships or private sale, motorists have become more open to buying a car online with 1 in 10 (10%) saying they would buy a car online without seeing it first. 77% say they would pay up to a €1,000 deposit online for a car while 17% would be open to paying for a car in full



Motorists would consider a switch to electric and hybrid cars with 70% saying they plan to buy an electric or hybrid car in the future, according to the Carzone report

#### MONEY AND MARKETS

The research found that insurance remains the top financial concern for 64% of Irish car owners.

Almost 1 in 5 (17%) cite the cost of fuel as their main worry, while 10% say general maintenance of their car is a financial concern.

Almost half (47%) of motorists claim their

insurance premium has increased in the last year with nearly a third (30%) opting to switch insurance provider in the last 12 months. 40% have remained with their insurance provider for over three years.

6 in 10 (58%) motorists would consider buying a car from the UK with perceived better value (82%) being the main reason.

However, the research also finds that consumers are still cautious about purchasing a car from the UK with two thirds (63%) saying that buying a car in the UK is too much hassle.

Other doubts include that it would be high risk (35%) and worries about Vehicle Registration Tax (35%).

#### **GOING GREEN**

The latest Carzone Motoring Report finds that diesel remains the most popular engine type to drive with 58% of motorists owning this type of vehicle.

Over a third (39%) own a petrol-fuelled car while only 2% of respondents drive a hybrid or electric car.

However, motorists would consider a switch to electric and hybrid cars with 70% saying they plan to buy an electric or hybrid car in the future with the Nissan Leaf and Lexus IS300h being the most searched electric and hybrid vehicles on Carzone so far this year.

It seems younger drivers (18-24-year olds) are more environmentally conscious with three quarters (77%) likely to purchase an electric or hybrid car in the future compared to those over 45 years old (63%).

Cheaper running costs (57%), better for the environment (20%) and tax incentives (10%) were the top reasons why people would buy an electric or hybrid vehicle.

36% of people were unaware of the Government's goal to reach 100% of all new cars and vans being EV's by 2030, and only 16% feel that it is achievable.







# Happy, happy times for our clubs as three head to Croker

It was a great weekend for Kilkenny club hurling. At every turn it was victory, victory, victory.

And now the colours of the three victorious outfits will fly in Croke Park on Saturday and Sunday week when the All-Ireland club finals will be staged.

Top of the bill will be that wonder outfit, the Shamrocks from Ballyhale.

We say wonder because they harvest so much from little playing rescources, one of the smallest parishes in the country.

They already head the All-Ireland club senior hurling championship Rollof Honour with seven victories.

They are the defending champions, and they will be putting their title on the line against Borris-Ileigh, who won their first Tipperary title in 30 years in 2019.

Borris-Ileigh won the All-Ireland club title once, in 1986-87 against Rathnure (Wexford). This latest Tipperary versus Kilkenny hurling showdown has really captured the imagination, so don't be surprised if headquarters houses a bigger than normal crowd on the day.

Shamrocks, incidentally, created a new mark when they retained the Kilkenny title last season. That was the first time they held on to the Walsh Cup following an All-Ireland success.

And now they are hoping to put All-Ireland wins together for the first time. It never ends with them....the writing of records, of blazing a hurling trail.

Manager Henry Shefflin and his backroom team of Richie O'Neill, Patrick Phelan and Tommy Shefflin (trainer) know their players very well, and even better, how to use them.

The important role they played in guiding the club back to Croke Park cannot be underestimated. There was serious planning; working players carefully with an easy hand through demanding inter-county and club schedules.

In the nerve testing All-Ireland semi-final victory over Slaughtneil (Derry) at the weekend, Shamrocks had to deal with a storm of a match in which anything could have happened.

The Derry side were much better hurlers than anyone could have imagined, and while things were never easy, Shamrocks gutted it out and won in the end by 2-24 to 2-19.

One of the great returns from that match was that it will help Shamrocks find the high intensity rhythm needed against Borris-Ileigh, who claimed a fair scalp (St Thomas of Galway) in their semi-final.

The scene is set for what will be the first Kilkenny v Tipperary All-Ireland club senior hurling final.

There is almost something

magical about Tullaroan's march to Croke Park, the last step being a semi-final victory over a decent Naomh Éanna (Antrim) outfit.

The club is so steeped in the history of Gaelic games, and the people and parish so bound up in it, that every achievement is different with them.

This group served a tough apprenticeship to earn the right to play in GAA headquarters.

There have been knocks and heartache along the way, all of which have added to the joy of reaching the destination.

Now that Tullaroan are booked into Croke Park - they play Fr O'Neill's of Cork in the final on the Saturday (6pm) - the objective remains the same - victory.

"Going to Croke Park is not a day out. It is about trying to win an All-Ireland title," was the warning from manager, Jimmy Coogan, to any who might be getting carried away in the excitement of achievements to date.

Kilkenny star, Padraig Walsh sang the same tune after the semi-final win. "It is all about finishing the job now," he said of the clash with Fr O'Neill's.

"Croke Park can be a very lonely place when you lose a big match there," added the man who felt the pain of defeat there with Kilkenny last September.

Now, at 38, Williams returns to the 2020 Australian Open still chasing Court's record of Grand Slam wins.


The American, a seven-time

# On your marks - the Streets of Kilkenny 5k is back for 2020!

Local running fans can mark the date on their calendars with glee from this Friday as the Streets of Kilkenny 5k opens for business.

The 2020 offering of the popular event will hit the city's streets again on Holy Thursday, April 7. Organised by Kilkenny City Harriers the run, which has gone from strength to strength, will open up for online registrations from Friday.

### T-SHIRTS. MEDALS

For people who are quick off the mark there will be t-shirts for the first 500 people who register. Organisers will also have a bespoke medal for all finishers of this year's race.

Designed to give Kilkenny people what they wanted - the chance to run through the city streets - the 5K gained attention further afield when it became part of the Kia Road Race Series for 2019.

It will be part of the national series once more in 2020, bringing runners from all over Ireland and beyond on a tour of the country as they battle to win big prizes.

Once more there will be cash prizes for the fastest finishers in both the men's and women's categories, as well as bonus prizes should the record times be shattered.

### **WINNING TIMES**

The time to beat for men, 14:15, was set by last year's winner Hiko Tanosa from the Dundrum South Dublin Athletics Club. The women's record is held by Sinead O'Connor from Leevale, who saw off a late charge from former winner Siobhan O'Doherty to win in 16:48.

The race will have the same route in 2020, with runners starting from Kilkenny Castle. The field will head down High Street and go out over St Francis Bridge, coming down John Street before taking on a second loop.

The course offers the chance to achieve a personal best, while also providing the opportunity to run freely through the city centre.




