

Fill your plate for Polio - Rotary hold coffee and cake fundraiser

Kilkenny Rotary Club held a coffee and cake fundraising event at the Pembroke Hotel last Saturday morning in a bid to raise funds to aid ongoing worldwide efforts to eradicate polio.

The timing of 'Fill Your Plate For Polio' was symbolic, taking place on the eve of the 115th anniversary of Rotary International.

Kilkenny Rotary Club President Jason Dempsey used his speech that morning to emphasise the importance of polio eradication.

"In 1988 poliovirus was endemic to 125 countries, now it is endemic to only two - Pakistan and Afghanistan," he explained.

"Polio could become just the second human disease to be completely eradicated after smallpox, and we have a responsibility to finish the job."

Those in attendance were encouraged to drop a voluntary donation into the fundraising buckets as they sampled the sweet treats on offer.

The coffee and cakes were kindly provided by John Ryan, owner of the Pembroke Hotel and fellow Rotarian.

There are 72 Rotary clubs across Ireland and Kilkenny is one of the largest, with 60 members.

Rotary Kilkenny began in 1979 and is an active group of professional men and women who want to use their skills to 'give back' to the community.

It is a volunteer-led organisation whose members invest time and effort into local, national and international projects.

Grey skies over Kilkenny could not spoil the special gathering in the garden of Rothe House on Parliament Street of family, friends and colleagues of the late John Meaney of Coon East, Bilboa.

Exactly nine weeks to the day since John's sad passing, the occasion was the unveiling of a plaque and dedication of the latest feature of the restored Tudor garden to the memory of John. The newly installed dovecote was named the 'Meaney Dovecote' as a mark of respect to the late volunteer to the garden. For the past four years, he was actively involved, with his colleagues, in the maintenance and upkeep of the garden as part of the SOS Kilkenny social inclusion programme.

John, described as "one of life's true gentlemen" was a regular attendee on a Tuesday and was known for his hard work ethic and also his sense of humour and devilment. Although deaf, John was more than capable of communicating with his colleagues and staff of Rothe House simply by his signs, actions and facial expressions — and a remarkable sense of humour which could be conveyed without words.

Among the speakers at the event were supervisor and horticulturist with SOS Kilkenny Donal Croghan, President of the Kilkenny Archaeological Society Pat Nolan, head gardener in Rothe House & Garden Mary Pyke, and Peter Heary of Rothe House .

The brass plaque affixed to the post upon which a six bay dovecote is placed reads: "This dovecote is dedicated to the memory of John Meaney, volunteer who died December 2019. A sense of humour and joy that wont be forgotten. Rest in peace."

Entrepreneur devises app to get kids off social media

A leading Kilkenny tech entrepreneur has launched the world's first outdoor app designed to get people active with gamification and augmented reality.

Brendan Morrissey designed and created the bespoke social network called Mishon for like-minded people interested in outdoor lifestyle, fitness, health and wellbeing.

"A user gains points for sharing their life, commenting, posting, doing daily challenges, finding and completing augmented reality crates and creating Mishon Go events with friends," explained the tech guru. The entrepreneur who is behind a number of other successful ventures has partnered with the Irish Girl Guides for the launch.

"The Irish Girl Guides are raising funds to fit out their new training facility in Dublin 24 and came up with Mishon Moon where the guides will adventure their way to the moon on Mishon covering 363,000 kilometres (the distance to the moon and back). They're raising €363,000 to cover the fitout so if any sponsors would like to donate they can do through the Girl Guides website. It's full not for profit - 100% of monies raised go towards the training facility" he said.

The Kilkenny man explained the

importance of staying fit.

"I try to stay active - I get out three or four times per week. It's hard to motivate yourself to get out and be active so Mishon makes it fun to go and find daily Mishons around you. We've done a lot of research on how physical activity benefits the brain through one of our other projects iDyslexic.

"Activity helps people to focus and makes it easier to learn and achieve. Studies are showing that only 14% of Irish children are getting their required daily activity and that only 11% perform the required movement patterns. We hope Mishon can help them to become active," he added.



Don't give up cooking for Lent

Pancake Tuesday, then Ash Wednesday herald the start of Lent.

In Ireland, we have many traditions of giving something up, or taking on a project, during this season as a 'penance' or an attempt to be good during what was traditionally a very important season in Ireland, and still is on the religious calendar.

Lent includes the only two days on the Catholic calendar when we are supposed to 'fast' - not eat meat and eat sparingly.

In our house the traditional meal was smoked haddock for as long as I can remember on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. It was associated with penance but that didn't take from the deliciousness of the haddock!

These days I'm a bit more adventurous with haddock recipes. And it shouldn't be kept just for 'fast days.'

We'll start with a quick and easy dish.

SMOKED HADDOCK PASTA BAKE INGREDIENTS

(Serves two)

METHOD

2 frozen smoked haddock fillets (approx 100g/40z each)

150g / 6oz dried pasta 150g / 6oz frozen sweetcorn 50g / 20z grated cheddar

3/4 pint of milk2 Tablespoons of cornflour

Now for something that looks fancy but is easier to make than it's name might suggest!

EGGS EN COCOTTE WITH SMOKED HADDOCK INGREDIENTS

(Per person) 10g butter 20g leeks, finely sliced 20g smoked haddock, diced 1 large egg chives 1 tbsp double cream 1 pinch salt and pepper METHOD

Gently melt the butter in a saucepan and cook the leeks until they are soft.

Place the leeks into an individual ovenproof dish and spoon the diced smoked haddock on top. Season with salt and pepper.

Make a little well in the haddock and leek mixture and crack the egg into the hole. Spoon the double cream on the top.

Heat the oven at 170°C. Place the dish(es) into a tray of warm water and bake in the oven for about 15

minutes.

To serve sprinkle it with chopped chives and serve with toast for a posh breakfast.

And then there is the classic smoked haddock that we grew up with - cooked in milk and onions. Here's a version from legendary chef Delia Smith!

SMOKED HADDOCK WITH CREME FRAICHE, CHIVE AND BUTTER SAUCE INGREDIENTS

(Serves two)

350-400g(12-140z) smoked haddock

2 rounded tablespoons crème fraîche

1 heaped tablespoon snipped fresh chives

10g (½ oz) butter, diced 150 ml (5 fl oz) whole milk

black pepper

METHOD

Place the fish in the frying pan and add a little freshly milled black pepper but no salt.

Then pour in the milk (it won't cover the fish, but that doesn't matter), bring it up to simmering point and simmer gently, uncovered, for 8-12 minutes. You will be able to see quite clearly when they are cooked, as the whole thing will become pale and opaque.

Now carefully remove the fish to a plate using a fish slice, increase the heat and add the crème fraîche to the pan. Continue to simmer, uncovered, for 2-3 minutes, until the sauce reduces and thickens slightly, then whisk in the butter and return the fish to the sauce briefly.

Scatter in the chives, let it bubble for about 30 seconds and it's ready to serve.

Why your home is not an asset

was re-reading Robert Kiyosaki's, classic Rich Dad Poor Dad recently, and what struck me again, was one of the comments Mr Kiyosaki made in the book, when it was first released back in 1997.

It was hugely controversial at the time primarily because Kiyosaki was saying things that differed from what were long held implicit beliefs, primarily espoused and encouraged by banks who had a vested interest in getting people to think a particular way.

What made them and others, including publishers particularly uncomfortable (Kiyosaki ended up self-publishing the book) was his assertion, that your family home was not an asset. He said, it was actually a liability and one of the biggest you'll ever have.

It just so happened that shortly after I finished reading the book, I met with a new client who was based in Dublin. She had a mortgage in the amount of &850,000 and was paying back &4,030per month, which between her and her husbands' income they could afford.

Very quickly after she told me the amount she owed and what her monthly repayment was, she said the value of the property was about €1.2m which I think gave her comfort because she knew she owed a lot, and that was fine. But without wanting to burst her bubble, the value of her property didn't matter much if she was never going to sell it. And for her, she said this was her forever home. She'd never sell it, and it would be her home for as long as she was alive.

I thought after meeting her, that anyone who believes their home is an asset or an investment, like this lady thought her home was, need to maybe read Kiyosaki's book because he was right back then and he's right now.

It doesn't really matter what the value of your home is, unless you sell it. Of course, it matters when it comes to being able to move and having enough equity, and the lower your loan to value the better the interest rate you can secure. But if you're not planning on moving anytime soon or ever, it doesn't matter whether it's worth €10 million or €10 thousand.

But let's say your property does increase in value, and you want to cash in, what then?

Where are you going to live now?

The only instance when this doesn't matter is when you are trading down to a smaller less expensive house, moving back to a parents or in-law's house, or moving to a rented property. If neither apply, and you want to realise any gain in valuation increases, you have to find another property to live in and sell your existing one.

A real investment is one where you have control over when you can buy and

sell it. Examples of this would be shares or investments you've made. You can decide to take the increase almost immediately. When it comes to your primary residence, it's different. If your house has increased significantly in value, and you want to capitalise on its appreciation and take the equity out of the house, it's not that easy or quick. The process of selling a property can be quite time consuming, and very disruptive because people will want to view it etc. but you'll have to find a property to move into, and will the asking price of other properties have gone up as much as yours has?

Back to what Robert Kiyosaki said all those years ago.

The reason he said your primary residence is not an asset was because the definition of what an asset is, is something that puts money into your account and anything that takes it out is a liability. So, clearly your family home is a liability because if you have a mortgage, that's taking money out of your account every month. And even if you don't, its' still costing you money by way of property tax, insurance, maintenance costs etc.

A property you use as your primary residence, generates no cash flow unless you're making money from it. And that can come in the form of renting out a room or where you operate a business from the property.

When people look at the increase in the value of their property, they also seem to forget the mortgage repayments made, property taxes paid, insurance, renovations and so on. These are expenses which come at a cost, and over the course of a number of years, It doesn't really matter what the value of your home is, unless you sell it

they can run into thousands of Euros.

Other investment classes don't typically require the kind of on-going cash inputs that your home does, which again is to emphasise that its' not an investment in the true sense of the word. This is referred to the opportunity cost of home ownership which is money spent on a property that can't be used for any other purpose or used to invest.

For example, if you bought a property for €250,000, and 10 years' later it's worth €400,000, you might think a great investment. But if you run the numbers, and calculate how much you spent on mortgage repayments, insurance, maintenance etc. the return isn't as much as you think it is.

No doubt, its' great to have made €150,000 more than what you paid for it, but unless you bought the property for cash, you probably spent more on the property than you made in profit over those years, and if that happened with any other investment, you'd be fairly disappointed with the return.

The point, of this article, is not to discourage you from buying a property that becomes your family home, it's the opposite in fact. When you buy a property, you are effectively paying rent to yourself, which is good because it's money you won't have to pay when you retired, you're prepaying it now.

The moral of this story is, when you're buying a property, don't buy it thinking it's an investment for the future, because it's not, it's your home. And don't lose sight of the very basic reason you're buying it in the first place which is, to provide shelter to you and, your family.

ASK LIAM

Our personal finance expert answers your questions ...

Q: Liam, I set up a pension a number of years ago with Irish Life and the retirement age was set at 60. I'll reach that age in November, but I'm not ready to do anything with this policy as I'm working and plan on continuing to work until I'm 65. The amount in this fund is about €25,000 and I don't consider it my real pension as I have other funds in place. Do I have to take activate this policy when I'm 60?

A. You can extend the maturity date of your pension with Irish Life beyond the age of 60.

In fact, you can extend it beyond the age of 65 and not take benefits from it until you're 75, if you wanted to. And if you don't need the money, I would suggest you leave it where it is, as it continues to grow tax free within the fund.

If you don't contact Irish Life, they're likely to transfer your money into a cash fund, which is fine, but it will just sit there earning nothing. In fact, when you apply their annual management charge of 0.75% along with the return which is likely to be negative, you'll end up losing money.

So, I would recommend you contact Irish Life and advise them you don't plan on activating the fund when you're 60. You're not sure when you're going to activate it but when you do, you'll let them know. And rather than having your money transferred to a cash fund, tell them you'd like to continue invested in the same fund your currently in, that is assuming you're happy with it and continues to match your risk profile. Or you want to transfer it into any of their other funds of which there is about 40 to choose from.

When you do activate this fund, I would suggest you take 25% of it tax free and the balance can be taken either as (a) a taxable lump sum assuming you have other pension funds which have a locked minimum amount of €63,500 or you have an annual income > €12,700 per year or (b) it's transferred to an Approved Retirement Fund. Depending on the amounts, I would probably take a taxable lump sum rather than receive a small amount from it every year, especially if doesn't form a major part of your income in retirement.

Other things to consider are the time of year and the location of the nuptials. If the happy couple has booked somewhere off the beaten track for their reception then you can lean more towards casual than tailoring. **WHAT TO WEAR**

Let me begin by saying that it's perfectly acceptable to wear a suit to the afters of a wedding. A well-fitting suit will serve you for a range of social occasions, especially if it's in a versatile colour like navy or grey.

Even if it's your work suit, you can easily jazz it up with subtle details like a striped shirt, a knitted tie, a colourful handkerchief, a smart-looking watch and some polished derbies. It's the little things that make all the difference.

You don't need to wear a full suit to the afters of a wedding so I really wouldn't go buying one especially for it, but if you do want to go out and buy one then go for something that you'll get plenty of wear out of and that you could also wear as separates.

RELAX YOUR TAILORING

Given that you won't be attending the more formal ceremonies during the day, you're really aren't required to go fully formal in the evening so while you might still choose to wear a suit, you can relax things a little and opt for a knitted polo shirt or a grandfather collared shirt rather than a dress shirt and a tie. SEPARATES ARE SMART

You don't have to wear a tie, but if you do consider something more interesting than the standard workfare - a knitted tie is always a great option.

White shirts tend to look too much like workwear so look to something warmer and brighter like a sky blue, a pale pink or a pinstripe to lift your presentation while also looking elegant.

If it's a very casual affair then you can ditch the traditional button-up altogether and wear something more relaxed and


The rule of thumb is to stick to plain neutral colours in tonal shades that play well with your suit.

Promoting Infant Mental Health

BABIES can experience very strong emotions long before they have the words to describe them so it is really important that have parents and caregivers who can respond to these feelings:

CONTACT

Take the time to connect with your baby by talking, kissing and smiling as much as you can. Your voice and touch act as an incredible anchor for their sense of security and attachment.

RESPOND

Respond to your baby when she is unsettled. There is no such thing as spoiling a baby – you are helping her to return to a calm emotional state which is really important for teaching her coping skills later on.

NON-VERBAL LANGUAGE

Speak your baby's (nonverbal) language; Looking away and small blinks, for example, may indicate that she needs a rest so try to respond with a cuddle and lay her down for a nap.

Getting to the root of those IBO pains

AVE you been diagnosed with SIBO? Then you are one of the "luckier of the lot" who have been given a more specific answer and probably a partial solution to their digestive discomforts.

SIBO stands for Small Intestinal Bacterial Overgrowth-it is not an infection, but the normal bacteria get to the wrong place and over proliferate to produce the uncomfortable symptoms of bloating, pain,

abnormal bowel movements and even anxiety and depression. You might have had the diagnosis of IBS with the same symptoms. In fact, an estimated 70% of IBS patients have SIBO with elevated hydrogen and / or methane gas when examined with the right test.

SIBO can result from eating a typical sugary - milky Western diet full of snacks or failure of the gastric acid barrier either due to stress or medications: like antacids or reduced bile secretions in

your liver – gallbladder. SIBO can also be the result of failure of neurological issues within the gut; problems with the migrating motor complex that orchestrate small intestinal motility, leading to constipation and the bacteria normally

 $residing \, in the \, large \, intestine$ to make its way to the small intestine. Anatomic alterations, or impairment of systemic and local immunity may also play a role therefore thorough investigation is recommended.

The hydrogen breath test is an established non-invasive way for assessing malabsorption of sugars in the small intestine -this is what gastroenterologists order in hospitals to diagnose SIBO. However, there are patients who can suffer from the same spectrum of digestive issues but who produce little or no hydrogen, instead producing relatively large amounts of methane. These patients will avoid detection with the traditional hospital breath test for malabsorption based on hydrogen detection; therefore, several false

negatives would be expected. The current management strategies for SIBO centre on antibiotics and maybe elimination diets. The FODMAPs diet may provide symptom relief short term as it removes certain fermentable fibres from the intestine but excluding

healthy foods will lead to long term complications including the reduction in beneficial bacteria that are necessary for immune health. Antibiotics also create a reduction in diversity of your microbes for months - even years, which in turn will affect your overall health.

As always, the underlining imbalances need to be addressed. otherwise the bacteria can overgrow again. Individualized investigations and tailored dietary changes, stratified herbal remedies and lifestyle modification strategies may bring long-lasting results. In my clinic I use private functional tests to allow for a better understanding of your underlying imbalances, then tailor an action plan which best suits you. Fruits You Sir! Grow your own and reap the benefits

There is nothing better than picking your own fruit off your own tree and eating it straight from picking! It really is the simple things and we are here to start a revolution of fruit growing around the country.

If you have a nice open plot to grow your trees on then work away but we are also encouraging

you to think about other areas that you could grow fruit trees, how about a school project, we were planting up an avenue at our children's school with trees and thought why not plant fruit trees for the kids to enjoy so we planted a row along the avenue to the school gate, keeping them low enough so that they could pick the fruit. How about a green area? or a sports club or community centre. Your local rugby, soccer or GAA club will usually have an area at the front that is open and unused, why not plant 2 or 3 fruit trees. They tend to be the most inexpensive trees starting at a young but already fruiting 3 year old tree from €25.00.

If you have a green area why not talk to your residents

association about planting a grouping of fruit trees, wouldn't the kids and adults alike love the idea of picking fruit during the late summer and Autumn. Wouldn't it be lovely if one of the the local residents had time to make an apple or pear tart for the neighbours. Lets all join the movement to grow more fruit trees within our community.

Fruit trees need full sun to thrive. Apples, pears, and plums are tolerant of less-than-ideal conditions, they don't want to be waterlogged and as long as they have good air flow around them, they will fruit well, especially in a good summer.

FOOD AND WATER

Though fruit trees often prosper with only minimal care, paying attention to their needs will reward

you with a larger, more flavorful crop. Water newly planted trees whenever the top 2 inches of soil are dry. As the plants develop more extensive root systems, you can water less often-but keep in mind that, to produce a juicy crop, all fruit trees must be watered in dry periods.. Mulching helps conserve the moisture and keeps in the organic matter around the roots.

As a commercial grower we use a rigid fertilise regime to have our trees looking their best but getting the best growth and root structure in the pots but as a home grower and with the tree planted into the open soil your tree will require only minimal feeding. It's best to base your fertilising schedule on the growth of the tree, If it's growing satisfactorily, its nutrient needs are being met. If its performance is below par, though, apply a high-nitrogen fertiliser in early spring. PRUNING

First and foremost, it's highly recommended that you prune your fruit trees to a manageable

height. Although the thought of a 20-foot apple tree may seem appealing, think of the practicalities–even if you manage to reach the ripe apples at the top of the tree, what will you do with that much fruit? Trim to a height that will allow you to easily harvest and prune. If you can't reach above your head and easily pick fruit from the tree's tallest branch, it's likely too tall. Pruning will not only make your life easier but will make the tree healthier too.

When it's cold, prune for shape: February & amp; March are the ideal months to do your winter pruning. Try your best to prune

during a dry spell without a chance of frost, as fresh cuts on your tree can be particularly susceptible to moisture and cold. Since the majority of fruit trees are deciduous, winter is an excellent time to prune for shape without leaves or fruit cluttering your view. Remove crossing branches, anything that's growing back into the centre of the tree, or limbs that are broken or dead. The shape of the tree is up to you, but make sure its centre is open and uncluttered-it's important that air can move freely through the branches once the warmer weather returns and the tree is again covered in fruit and leaves. **STYLES OF FRUIT TREES**

We always have a good range of fruit trees which include some larger trees and also some shaped fruit trees, why not consider an



TRANSFORM

Music Generation Kilkenny is part of Ireland's national music education programme, initiated by Music Network and co-funded by U2, The Ireland Funds, the Department of Education and Skills and Local Music Education Partnerships. The programme seeks to transform the lives of children and young people ages 0-18 by creating access to high quality, affordable music tuition in their localities.

Kilkenny was selected for participation in the programme through a competitive application process in 2017, led by KCETB in partnership with Kilkenny County Council. Sinéad was appointed to the post of Music Generation Development Officer in 2019, in order to manage overall development and implementation of the programme across the county.

Following an initial planning and development phase, Music Generation Kilkenny commenced its first singing programmes in primary schools in Castlecomer and Thomastown in September 2019, with further expansion now happening in 2020.

This includes an after school music hub planned for the young people of Abbey Community College, Ferrybank, who will have the chance to learn drum kit, electric guitar, acoustic guitar, bass and vocals.





NEW CORSA IS WELL PLACED TO COMPETE

DAVID WALSHE

I reckon we all know someone who has had a Corsa. It is one of those cars that appeals to drivers of all ages - the Opel Beetle if you like. In Europe, they have sold 13 million of them since it was introduced.

Well, Opel has just launched the sixth generation of the Corsa, the brand's best-selling model with an all-electric version due in Ireland this April. The range starts from €17,975 and it stands a very good chance of luring buyers. With modern, dynamic lines and a lowered body stance, delivering a more sporty, athletic exterior, the all-new Corsa offers increased interior space and comfort, all the while retaining its renowned German precision for detail.

It has design cues from a lot of cars currently in the sector which is a common enough trait with all new cars.

I wish it was a bit bolder like its now sister, the new Peugeot 208. Whilst the overall exterior height has been reduced to deliver better aerodynamics and lower CO2 and consumption, an increase in front headroom, a longer wheelbase and increased overall exterior length return optimum cabin space and comfort for passengers. The boot volume is increased (+24 litres) to 309 litres, or up to 1,081 litres with seats folded.

At the launch, we were given an insight into how future Opels will be sold. The range will have defined, easy to understand trim level steps with matching pricing. SAFETY FEATURES

It's a formula that we've seen before and it works - making the decision on the part of the buyer a lot easier. Available in three trims – SC, SRi and Elite - safety technology features available as standard, or as an option, dependent on trim include Forward Collision Alert with Automatic Emergency Braking and Pedestrian Detection, radar-based Adaptive Speed Control, Lane Departure Warning and Traffic Sign Recognition.

The new Opel Corsa also brings to the segment for the very first time, adaptive glare-free IntelliLux LED matrix lighting.

We got to drive it on a variety of roads and my overall impression of the car was one of quietness. There's a choice of two petrol engines (1.2 75bhp or 1.2 100bhp), matched to a manual gearbox or an 8-speed automatic, and a 1.5 102bhp diesel engine manual, from launch, the improved Corsa delivers a reduction in CO2 of up to 25%. The 75bhp will suit most buyers but for those who like a bit more brio the 100bhp version is the one to go for. It makes for a much more stress-free journey.

The merger with Peugeot brings about some shared components as would be expected from a prudent financial perspective but those familiar with both brands can see the join. I suppose the rationale is the best of both worlds which is a goal to be aimed for sure.

Available now, the new Corsa is well placed to compete in the very competitive supermini sector where its pedigree should retain existing Opel drivers and attract new ones.

It won't be easy but the newly invigorated Opel will certainly be well up for the challenge.

Eight gen of Porsche 911

Hugh Maguire: reviews the latest generation of the 'most iconic sports car in the world'

Worldwide Porsche car sales are doing very well, though here in Ireland the numbers are relatively small they are also growing particularly with models such as the Cayenne and Macan Sports SUV's.

The focus of this review is the iconic 911 Carrera S Type 992 launched just last year in Ireland.

HAS IT ANY STREET CRED?

The shape of the iconic 911 has evolved over 56 years of production. Some say not enough, that a 911 still looks too much like the original. But the latest 911 is without doubt another success of the evolutionary styling.

It's a 911 of that there is no doubt but its longer wheelbase and wider track, larger 20" and 21" wheels give this supercar an even more purposeful and dynamic stance than before.

WHAT'S IT LIKE INSIDE?

The new cabin beautifully crafted, with bullet proof build quality as you would expect from

Porsche.

The new dash is now digital except for the centrally mounted analogue rev counter. More of the cars controls are now operated through an all-new 10' touchscreen save for a few beautifully crafted aluminium switches for key functions.

I don't like everything about the new digital dash, especially the fact that the outer instruments for fuel and external temperature are now obscured by the sports steering wheel.

That tiny new little gear shift selector has also come in for a lot of criticism. Paddle shifts on the steering wheel allowing manual shifting.

From the moment you sit into the leather clad figure hugging sports seats you know you are sitting in a very special sports car. Blending over 55 years of Porsche sports car tradition with modern technology.

The driver sits low down into the car, you feel part of it. The level of standard equipment is very good but as always with Porsche their is an extensive and very tempting options list that will soon push the asking price to wallet busting limits! You can "build your own Porsche" to exactly to your specifications on their configurator. The fit and finish is

absolutely top class from the visible stitching on the crafted full leather upholstery to the smallest switch, it all feels as though a real craftsman put it together. It so typically Porsche.

WHATS UNDER THE BONNET?

Nothing thats where your luggage goes! The rear engined 911 Carrera S is powered by a 3.0 litre 450 BHP flat six cylinder petrol engine with four camshafts, 24 valves and Variocam plus. Mated to an amazing 8-speed PDK double clutch semi automatic system the combination offers blistering performance.

With PDK the new 911 will hit 100km/h from a standstill in just 3.8 seconds and continue to a top speed of 308 km/h.

Yet driven with restraint (which is difficult) it returned on average 31mpg. But this car is all about performance and suffice to say the 911 Carrera is incredibly quick.

We are in supercar territory here. Floor the throttle (or use the launch control system) and the 911 accelerates unabated towards the horizon.

It just never seems to run out of power. Its incredible.

WILL I ENJOY DRIVING IT?

The balance and handling from the rear engine rear wheel drive 911 is a purists dream. Levels of grip are simply phenomenal and its safe to say that on a public road you will never be able to explore the full capabilities of this car. Its always better than you can deliver as a driver.

A true motoring legend and a masterpiece of automotive engineering. Its quiet and refined too apart from some tyre roar on coarse surfaces, while the sound of that legendary flat-six is intoxicating. However with this latest 911 992 you need to dig deeper to unearth that sports car character and that's a pity. It has become a bit more of a GT than sports car.

VERDICT

Prices for the new 911 Carrera start at a shade over €149,000. The 911 Carrera S starts €167,680 and both rise rapidly as you add in goodies from the tempting options list.

However if you can afford it and want to have the most iconic sports car in the world parked on your driveway then there is only one choice, a Porsche 911.







hile the cancellations due to bad weather earlier in the month means that Group A of the Allianz National Hurling League won't be completed next weekend, the finishing sequence will be decided in Division 1B where all six counties have played four of five games.

The top-placed side in each division will advance directly to the semi-finals, while the second and third placed teams will qualify for the quarter-finals.

All the games in Division 1B will be played at the same time (2pm) on Sundy.

The pairings are Clare v Dublin in Ennis; Laois v Kilkenny in UPMC Nowlan Park; Wexford v Carlow in Chadwicks Wexford Park.

Donnacha and Tadgh trade Thomastown for South Africa!

Canoeing

Two of Kilkenny's most experienced kayakers will take on the best in the world in an international event this week.

Donnacha Brennan and Tadgh de Barra, members of the Thomastown Paddlers canoe club, have made the trip to South Africa in search of adventure. Their target is the three-day Dusi river race which runs from Pietermaritzburg to Durban in South Africa.

The race, which includes 120km of extremely fast and challenging river, features obstacles including weirs and long stretches of rapid water which present an extreme capsize risk, even to experienced paddlers.

As if that wasn't enough, many of these sections are strewn with rocks, often with just one clear pathway through making collision damage almost inevitable. Get the incorrect racing line through these sections, your race will end in seconds. DANGEROUS

However,

challenges aren't on the water. Many of the river sections are too dangerous to paddle, requiring the paddlers to get out and run alongside.

all

the

In other sections long river loops are circumvented by the paddlers running with their kayaks. The running sections add up to 18km over often variable terrain, where fast running times are essential to remain competitive.

For Tadgh and Donnacha, who are the only Irish paddlers competing this year, the winter training schedule has been intense and has

included early morning paddling and running in three hour sessions. **LOGISTICS**

Preparations have also involved much more than river racing and trail running. River racing lines have had to be studied and the whole logistics of the trip planned to perfection. Both paddlers have an impressive pedigree, and are regular winners in the annual divisional race series. Both have a number of Liffey Descent medals in their collection and have represented their country in numerous international events in different kayak disciplines. But the Dusi presents a once-in-a lifetime challenge, as it is the world's most famous kayak race. **TOP 100 FINISH**

It is an incredible honour for the small Thomastown club to have a two of its members competing in this race. And they are not just going to complete the race; in a field of 1.200 to 1.500 kayakers, they are targeting a top 100 finish.

It would be an incredible feat for the Thomastown club, which constantly punches above its weight at competitive racing events. This comes as no surprise as the dedication of a core group of club stalwarts continues to foster the sport with one or two new junior paddlers arriving on the racing scene each year.

The young Limerick rider grabbed the headlines when getting the 14/1 chance up in the dying strides to win from the Mags Mullins-trained Agusta Gold.

The narrow winner is unlikely to get into the Irish Grand National itself and the champion trainer is already eyeing up a race on the final day of the Punchestown festival for the seven-year-old.

Mullins was the big winner again at the County Kildare venue on Wednesday where he landed the race run in honour of his great race mare Quevega.


