'Stay positive and live life to the fullest'

A 23-year-old Tipperary man with epilepsy is "living life to the fullest" after a difficult ten years.

Mullinahone's Chris O'Brien lost his dream apprenticeship and was told he would have to take some time off the road because of the central nervous system disorder, but he is staying positive and driving on with his future plans to become a salesman.

"I only had seizures when I was a asleep at first but when I turned 20 I started having them during the day. What upset me the most was when I was told I had to stop driving and had to sell the car. I have to be seizure free for a vear before I can drive again. It's not ideal always looking for bus and train times and relying on lifts," Chris tells South Tipp Today.

"I was an apprentice plumber two years ago, and at the end of the first year the foremen called me in and said 'you didn't tell me you had epilepsy' even though I put it on the form at the start. He said I was a liability and let me go. He said nobody in the trade would ever take me on

and that it would be best I get out of the trade. It was a real knock back because I loved being a plumber and it's what I had always set my mind on doing," he continues.

Chris was left "shocked" after being diagnosed with epilepsy at the age of 13. "I was down in Irish camp and went to bed one night and when I woke up there were a load of people around me. I had a seizure in my sleep and was brought to hospital where the doctor said it was triggered by tiredness and that it was a once off. But it happened again and again. I had to go to Dublin for an MRI and that's when I was told I had epilepsy. It was a shock because I didn't know what I could and couldn't do," Chris admits.

But learning to cope with epilepsy over the past decade has made Chris a stronger person, and he is thankful to his family and friends for their support. He is currently studying Epilepsy Ireland's flagship course Training For Success at IT Sligo, and plans to pursue a degree in Marketing and Sales in the fu-

"I still play hurling and football in Sligo and go for pints with the lads. Even in secondary school at Presentation Ballingarry people knew I had it and never treated me differently. My friends have never said 'we can't hang around with you

because you have epilepsy'," Chris highlights.

Monday 12th February marks World Epilepsy Day, and Chris is encouraging people struggling to deal with an epilepsy diagnosis to stay positive. "My main advice to people who are just after being diagnosed is to not let it hold them back or get them down. Hang around with people who are positive, and if people don't want to hang around with you because you have epilepsy then they are not your real friends. If you want to play sport do it, unless a doctor tells you not to. And as the saying goes, live life to the fullest," he adds.

Carrick-on-Suir to benefit from project to replace old water mains

Residents and businesses in the Carrick-on-Suir will benefit from a much more secure and reliable water supply as a result of an Irish Water project to replace 5km of the aging Crotty's Lake Trunk main. The section of main being replaced provides water to parts of Carrick-on-Suir from the Crotty's Lake

to frequent bursts and a high level of leakage in recent years, leading to regular disruptions to supply for customers.

This project will address this problem by replacing the aging mains with modern plastic water mains. Mark O'Duffy, Water Networks Programme Regional Lead

mented: "By replacing this old section of water main we will resolve what has become a regular problem of supply outages due to burst pipes. This will benefit the residents and businesses in Carrickon-Suir and surrounding areas by providing them with a secure and reliable water supply. "This work will also reduce

leakage on the network which will help to reduce the volume of treated water that that is lost unnecessarily and will result in improved water pressure for customers."

Construction work got underway on 22nd January and is expected to take five months to complete. During that time, the project team will work closely with the local community to minimise any disruption to customers.

The work sections will be limited to short sections and traffic management arrangements will be put in place to minimise impact on customers. The works may involve some short-term water shut offs and the project team will ensure that customers are given a minimum of 48 hours prior notice of any planned water shut offs. Customers can contact the Irish Water call centre on 1850 278 278 if they have any

This project forms part of Water's national Leakage Reduction Programme which will see an investment of over €500 million nationally over the next four years to improve the public water supply. These works will ensure that customers have a more reliable service and experience fewer water outages due to burst pipes and leaks. The new pipes will also ensure a clean and safe water supply for all our customers.

Research report launched to over 100 businesses and agencies

Months of research, analysis and debate came together in the Anner Hotel, Thurles, recently with the official launch by the Tipperary **Local Enterprise Office and Tipperary Education and** Training Board of their training and skills gap report.

The report, entitled 'Analysis of the Education, Training and Business Support Needs of Companies in County Tipperary', provided a detailed review of employee training and education gaps in the county.

The event was attended by over 100 local businesses and agency representatives.

The report was commissioned jointly by the Tip-perary Local Enterprise Office and the Tipperary Education and Training Board. The appointed research agency, Marla Communications, engaged directly with 110 Tipperary companies to identify their challenges, concerns and gaps in the areas of employee training, skills and education. The research focused mainly on companies with over 10 employees, and spanned a wide spectrum of business sectors including manufacturing, tourism, retail and customer

Officially launching the

report, Roger Kennedy, Leas Cathaoirleach of Tipperary County Council, applauded the local agencies for their initiative in taking this research forward, highlighting the value the insights now bring to all employers and agencies in the county. "Tipperary has a working population of 700,000 within an hour's commute, and we are within an hour of nine leading third level colleges. Continuous monitoring of training and development needs is essential to ensure we have an adequate supply of skilled people to meet present and future needs".

Cllr. John Hogan, chairperson of Tipperary Education and Training Board, acted as master of ceremonies on the night, introducing those directly involved in the research initiative, including Rita Guinan, Head of Enterprise at the LEO, Eileen Condon, Director of Further Education and Training and Sheila Gallogly, Managing Director of Márla Communications. Rita Guinan highlighted the timely nature of the report, having had direct contact with employers on their skills shortage issue in recent months. Eileen Condon spoke of current and future employment trends and of particular further education and training programmes in Tipperary

Board that have strong employment outcomes, namely Post Leaving Certificate Programmes, Apprenticeships, VTOS courses and the Skills for Work programme that upskills the employed. She also referred to the growing demand for apprenticeships in Irish industry, and the opportunities for women in traditional craft apprentices.

Post the panel presentations, a lively round table discussion followed, businesses from all sectors sharing their views on how to take the 'next step'. All attendees agreed with the report recommendation to set up an Employers Forum to allow for the sharing of insights, exchanging of ideas and exploring the training and upskilling requirements of the businesses in the

'Tipperary town roads are worse than that of a third world country'

The state of the roads in Tipperary town is getting a lot of traction on Facebook recently with people being encouraged to write to Tipperary County Council and to contact their TDs and councillors about the shocking situation facing car owners and pedestrians in the town every day, writes Canon Hayes Recreation Centre chairman Martin Quinn.

The Tipp Town Facebook page is asking possible to copy and paste a letter from a Tipperary citizen and forward it to Customer Services at Tipperary County Council. The letter raises the issue of the serious condition of the roads in Tipperary Town and surrounding areas, and says: 'It looks like the people of Tipperary town and the hinterland surrounding it have been completely forgotten about. We have listened to broken promises one after another and now the day has come where our roads are worse than that of a third world country'.

The letter goes on to say that if anything happens to their car because of the disgraceful condition of the roads that they will be holding Tipperary County Council responsible. They hope that hundreds of emails will be sent and that the powers that be will have to listen if they get many complaints in writing.

People commenting on the post on Facebook are venting their anger also at politicians who they claim have neglected the town for years. One poster says that 'It shouldn't have to resort to this but Tipperary town has never really had a strong political figure who can talk in the right circles in Dublin and hence infrastructure and a major employer coming or staying in the town has passed us by over the years'.

Another person highlights: The roads are an absolute disgrace what are our **HAVE YOUR SAY**



local councillors doing?' Another adds: 'Tipperary town is a joke, driving from Cashel road to Limerick road is a disgrace with potholes and no one is doing anything about it'

Road conditions are compared to third world countries, with one poster underlining: 'I've actually been in third world countries where the roads are better than what they are here. And that is no exaggeration'.

Another poster writes about the damage done to their vehicle: 'Limerick road is a joke. Made bits of a leaf spring on the back of my van during the week cost almost €750 to get repaired. Yet we are paying top dollar for rates in the town'.

The rates issue surfaces a lot in the post with many saying to stop paying road tax

until Tipperary town streets and roads are resurfaced. However, most posters feel that the best course of action is to write to Tipperary County Council and to TDs and councillors.

Along with the concern for vehicles, there is also great concern expressed for the safety of pedestrians, with many worried about the risk of an accident. Somebody will have a serious accident, yet another local person underscores: 'You can't even cross the road without dodging a pothole. I for one am sick of it. Will it take a serious accident or a child falling in a pothole out in front of a car to get it fixed? Pure disgrace it is'.

Kathy features in powerful video about dementia diagnosis

A Tipperary woman with dementia features in a powerful video launched to educate healthcare professionals about supports needed when a person receives a dementia diagnosis.

Cashel's Kathy Ryan, who was diagnosed with early onset dementia in 2014, heartbreakingly described 'fading away' in front of her two sons Andrew and Matt in an interview with South Tipp Today last April.

Kathy features in the new video 'The Experience of a Dementia Diagnosis', which is a joint campaign by the Irish Dementia Working Group (IDWG) and the Dementia Carers Campaign Network (DCCN), developed to highlight the different experiences that people have of receiving a diagnosis including people of different ages, genders and with different types of dementia.

The video includes personal experiences from people with dementia and family carers, including members of the IDWG and the DCCN.

In addition to this, the advocates are joined by Dr. Tony Foley from the PREPARED project (Primary Care Education, Pathways and Research of Dementia), a three-year



national primary care dementia project which aims to support GPs and primary care team members in their delivery of integrated dementia care in the community.

In the coming months, the two advocacy groups, which are both coordinated and supported by The Alzheimer Society of Ireland, will seek opportunities to present to healthcare professionals including GPs, public health nurses, geriatricians, neurologists, memory clinics, physicians, Nursing Homes Ireland and third-level students about this issue.


All healthcare professionals are being encouraged to visit dementiapathways.ie, which is a web-based clinical education resource designed for Irish GPs and community based healthcare professionals.

Dementiapathways.ie is part of PREPARED, which is a

project that is part of the overall implementation of the Irish National Dementia Strategy.

The number of people with dementia in Ireland is expected to more than double over the next 20 years, from 55,000 today to 113,000 in 2036. Dementia affects 50 million people worldwide – a number that will almost triple by 2050.

Kathy, who is a member of the IDWG, said: "I was told I had mild cognitive impairment - that didn't sound so bad. But as I was crossing the [following the carpark meeting], I met the nurse who had assessed me, she apologised for not being with me for the diagnosis. I thanked her and said I was fine. Again she apologised. In that moment I knew, either I hadn't something something hadn't been said. I asked her: 'Are you saying I have Alzheimer's?' And the answer was 'yes'. Even though it can be heartbreaking to hear those words for the first time, I would have preferred if I had been told straight out that I had dementia. For me, not using the word gives it more power and helps to reinforce the stigma that, as people living with the condition, we are fighting against.'

Cllr. Richie Molloy hits out at Good Friday alcohol ban being lifted

Independent councillor Richie Molloy says he is disappointment with the abolishing of the ban on pubs opening on Good Friday.

Cllr. Molloy expresses the view that the passing of legislation in the Dáil to allow the sale of alcohol on Good Friday

is "the end of another bit of Irish culture" and believes "it's typical of Government to abolish this law so easily and yet has dragged its heels with allowing the sale of alcohol so freely in the various supermarkets around the country".

He continues: "The sale of cheap alcohol in supermarkets has led to huge problems in Ireland and this is the area that should have been tackled".

Cllr. Molloy feels publicans would have been happy to close on Good Friday.

"It would allow pub owners to renovate premises and gives staff time off on fixed days of the year".

In his criticism of the Intoxicating Liquor (Amendment) Bill 2017 being signed into law, Cllr. Molloy suggests that Government could have

taken the opportunity to ensure Good Friday was a national awareness day with a focus on a healthy relationship with alcohol. "Government could have used Good Friday as educational awareness on drinking and its effect on growth and personal

development".

Cllr. Molloy adds: "I cannot see any merit in the Government's arguments that it will increase tourism as Ireland and Tipperary have plenty to offer as an alternative if the pub happens to be closed on Good Friday."

Rockwell displayed great


Rockwell displayed great guile throughout and were more physically dominant. However, they made too many handling errors and will need to improve greatly to get past Crescent in Thomond Park.

A spring in our step

threatening he rain was holding off, but the dark clouds encouraged us to stay near to the school.

Still there was plenty of nature to be discovered, and often the most interesting wildlife stories are right under vour nose.

I was in St. Michael.s Girls National School in Tipperary town. We started of inside the classroom, and discussed that the winter is slowly fading into spring and some of the signs of that change. Birds are singing more, and flowers like snowdrops and crocus are blooming.
Outside in the school yard,

we examined the purple and white heather in a bed. The girls were aware that these flowers are important for early queen bees, and packed full of life building pollen and

Nature is a feast for all the senses including our noses. I passed around the purple flowers of winter heliotrope, which have a very fragrant scent. The leaves were also out, and I loved the description from one of the students that they looked like frog

We closed our eyes and listened to a robin singing. I asked the students to describe as best they could any bird they see and to use their hands to give its size. Learning describe to plumage and size are two basic skills of a birdwatcher, and you can never start too

Next we saw a pied wagtail in the school yard. He is a familiar bird as he resident in the school throughout the year. We went through our checklist, from his long wagging tail, black and white plumage and about the size of a closed fist.

Through the back gate brought us to the back of St. Michael's Church. Old stone

walls are often overlooked habitats, but are full of interesting plants. Growing from the mortar we found wall rue, valerian and Maidenhair spleenwort.

Ivy tumbled over the wall, and I explained that the berries are eaten by birds and that they will also nest in the tangle of branches. We squashed a few between our fingers and the seeds popped out. Insects like moths and bees also feed on the ivy

Another robin greeted us with a song, and the girls saw a yellowish bird with white cheeks and a black line down its belly. From the bird guide, we identified them as a pair of great tits that were foraging in the ash trees.

At the side of the sports complex, we talked about an unusual tree. Eucalyptus trees are normally found in Australia, where tȟey are the food plant of the Koala bear. These seem to survive fine in Ireland's wet and cold climate, and this tree was at least 20 years old. The bark is peeling, but like the London plane, this is a good adaptation to deal with pollution.

By the base of an old stone wall we found empty snail shells, and many of these were damaged and centred on a large stone. I showed the class a photo of the song thrush that uses a stone called an anvil to break open the hard shells and get at the soft bodies

The path between the church and the scout's hall revealed a bird that appeared in the student's homework. A sharp teacher spotted a collared dove on the branch of the tree and we marvelled at its pinkish colours with a neat black colour. The previous night they had to learn the word 'dove' as part of their

The tall spire of the church drew our eyes up and we saw a grey hooded crow at the very top. We could see its grey belly, and from there they have a fantastic view into the schools and can watch for the end of breaks. Even the toiling Angelus bells failed to make the bird move on. A robin hopped along the ground giving the class good views until it disappeared underneath a car.

Back on the street we picked some long catkins from a tree, and a song thrush obliged us with a burst on song from a well wooded garden. He repeated each phrase three times, and this helped identify the bird.

Just as we were leaving after lunch I was gently reminded that I promised to call in to another class and listen to their reports from their nature walk. The student's reports were excellent, and they even had a drawing of me out enjoying nature.

As I got into my car I heard a wren singing and a beautiful male bullfinch came down to feed on the lawn in front of the car. A perfect end to a great morning exploring nature.

The news around the environment is often dire, but the interest these students are showing is hope for us all and the future of wildlife.

An upcoming Tipperary birdwatch event takes place on 26th February in Halla Na Feile, Cashel, at 8pm. All are welcome and admission is free to indoor events but donations might sought to cover cost of room and speaker. The event, titled Barn Owls in Tipperary, looks at the positives and the pressures on the population in their stronghold by John

LEGAL ADVICE



Listen to our children

Child custody and access battles in Irish courts are something solicitors try to avoid, favouring instead mediation and other more amicable ways of solving family disputes.

However, sometimes the courts are needed to make the final decision when no agreement can be achieved. When it comes to custody and access, Irish law has put an increasing importance on the voice of the child.

If a parent who is not a legal guardian of the child, or indeed any adult family member (such as a grandparent or aunt/uncle), is seeking access through the courts, the judge will decide on what is in the best interests of the child.

To decide what is in the best interest of the child, the court will often need to take on board the views of the child themselves, especially where parties before the court are giving conflicting evidence as to what the child

GOING FOR COFFEE WITH THE CHILD

The court can be an intimidating arena for a child and so a child's views will be obtained in a different way than that of an adult, who would typically be called in to give evidence in a witness box.

Instead, a child's views will be sought in the way the judge feels is most appropriate. This might be by way of a representative - a person who will talk to the child outside court and represent their interest within it. Alternatively, the court may commission a report by a social worker or child psychologist for example, who will interview anyone relevant in the child's life and report back to the judge.

The court can also talk directly to the child themselves, usually by conversation in an informal setting, perhaps in the judge's offices. Indeed, we have seen this meeting take place in a café next door to the courthouse as the judge thought this to be the most comfortable setting for the child.

The key element in receiving the views of the child is that the parents will not be there to hear it and will not be aware of what the child has said. The scenario of a child in a witness box looking down on both parents and making a decision in public as to where they want to go does not happen.

NOT FOR EVERYONE

Despite best efforts, this process can still be very troubling for a child and in some cases the views of the child will not be sought.

It may be decided that to put the child in a position where they feel they have chosen one parent over another would do more harm than good. It may also be decided that the child is not yet mature enough to make any decision.

As with all things in family law, circumstances are incredibly important and each case will be different.

THE 'BEST INTEREST OF THE CHILD'

Listening or not listening to the views of the child is only part of ultimately deciding what is in the best interests of the child. This begs the question, what does 'best interest of the child' mean?

Essentially, it is an umbrella term for all the factors that are important for the child such as their relationships with each parent, their educational and personal needs as well as other needs such as religious or cultural influences.

Ford claims top spot in January car sales 2018 for Tipperary

With all the talk of Brexit and imported cars, you might expect new car sales figures to be down on last year in Tipperary, but you would be wrong, as levels have remained nearly identical to 2017.

The SIMI recently released their January report showing the volume of new registered passenger car sales in January 2018 by model and make, with Ford claiming top spot on both

The new model Ford Focus claimed the honour of top model sold in Tipperary (59), with the Hyundai Tucson a close second (54) and Ford Fiesta in third place (47). This is very similar to the same time last year, albeit Tucson and Focus swapped places this year, but it does show a consistency that is very promising for the future of both Ford and Hyundai in Tipperary.

The report also details the top makes sold in January 2018. We can see from the sales data that Ford comes first with 171 units, Toyota second with 154 and Hyundai third with 120 units sold. This data also shows that Ford, Toyota and Hyundai have a 40 per cent combined share of the Tipperary market.
