Promoting tourism the priority for new Mayor of Clonmel

"I really want to push tourism in a big way and show the wider public what the area has to offer," says newly elected Clonmel Borough District Mayor Cllr Richie Molloy.

Mayor Molloy feels the Suir Blueway cycle and walkway from Clonmel to Carrick-on-Suir could bring thousands of tourists to County Tipperary every year if it's marketed properly.

"It will be officially opened shortly and I will be asking the council to promote it and make sure word is out there about it. There is more and more people out cycling the last couple of years and it's a huge plus for the area," Mayor Molloy tells South Tipp Today.

Mayor Molloy wants a visitor centre at the former Bulmers site at Dowd's Lane in Clonmel to replicate the success of the Guinness Storehouse in Dublin. "I will be pushing for it to be developed like the Smithwick's brewery in Kilkenny. The Guinness Storehouse is the most visited site in the

country, we have Bulmers and the cider-making history here in Clonmel and it just needs to be pushed by the Local Authority to bring it to fruition," Mayor Molloy continues.

Mayor Molloy says the old Kickham Barracks also has a role to play in driving tourism. "There is a Master Development Plan done on Kickham Barracks and a big part of that would be the Garda barracks going in there and there is some sort of scope for a plaza for outdoor concerts. You would be amazed at the amount of people that came into the town for the Junction Festival and if that site is developed it would be a way of

bringing more people into Clonmel".

Mayor Molloy praises Clonmel Tidy Towns committee and outdoor council staff for their work around the town. "I am very proud of how the town has developed and they have played an important role in that. I would encourage people to get involved in the Tidy Towns in Clonmel because it takes a lot of hands to do that kind of work and it's part of making the town attractive to tourists".

Mayor Molloy, who is the local area manager for Family Carers Ireland, will also continue to represent carers in the area. "Our annual marathon is always very successful

and we hope to add a family marathon, run over in Powerstown Park, to the event this October".

He is "honoured" to be Mayor of Clonmel for a second term, having previously served in the role during the 2007/2008 council term, and thanks councillors Andy Moloney (NP), Martin Lonergan (NP), Pat English (WUAG) and Catherine Carey (SF) for their support. "We formed a pact after the last Local Elections because we felt there was a swing towards Independents. It was agreed that I would be Mayor last and I am very thankful to the pact for keeping their commitment," he adds.

Iconic Cormac's Chapel at the Rock of Cashel re-opens to the public

The Office of Public Works (OPW) has welcomed the official re-opening of Cormac's Chapel, an Irish Romanesque style building which forms part of the Rock of Cashel complex, following an extensive conservation project.

The project involved extensive works over a period of time to replace the failing roof of the Chapel and address the issue of water penetrating into the building and causing damage to the historic interior. The Chapel is now safe from the effects of rainwater which can no longer leak into the building and the walls have been allowed to progressively dry out, revealing the wonderful remnants of the medieval wall paintings inside.

"We in the OPW are delighted to present the completed Cormac's Chapel to visitors again. This has been a really technically difficult and complex conservation

project and we are delighted that it has turned out so well. We are sure that visitors will agree with us when they see the magnificent wall paintings which have now been saved by the conservation action we've taken," said John McMahon, OPW commissioner.

The Rock of Cashel is a spectacular collection of buildings set on an outcrop of limestone and is one of Ireland's most important early medieval monuments. A fortress is said to have existed on the site from the 4th or 5th century and the name itself, Caiseal in modern Irish, is an early borrowing from the Latin, castellum, meaning fort.

Cormac's Chapel is situated on the south-east side of the main cathedral and is not only one of the most significant early Romanesque style buildings in Ireland, but contains the fragments of an

immensely important scheme of wall paintings. The paintings had suffered deterioration due to the poor environmental conditions in the Chapel; both liquid water and water vapour made the walls extremely wet and led to algal growth obliterating the paintings from view and gradually eroding them completely. The condition of the building, although structurally stable, was also identified to be extremely vulnerable to penetrating rainwater and this led to the decision to carry out this extremely challenging and complicated conservation project.

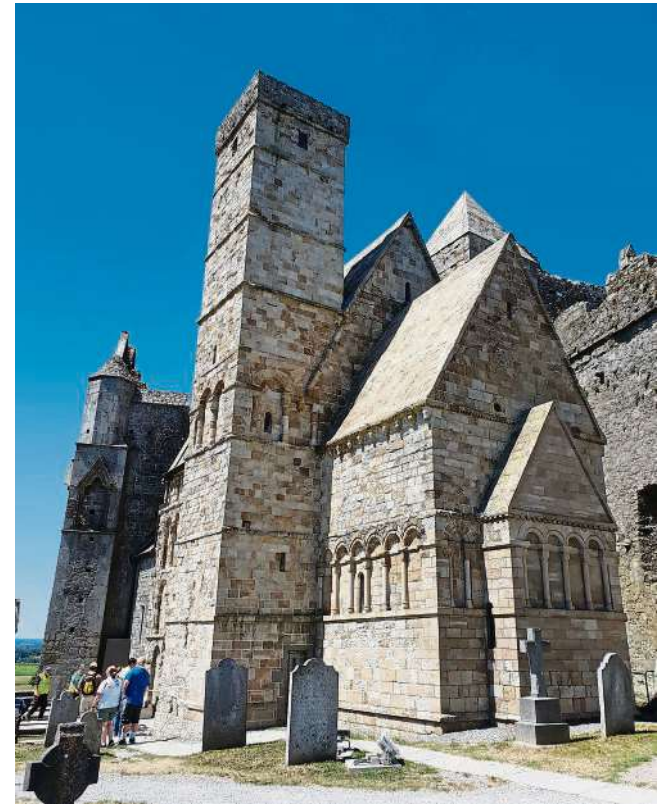
"In January 2010, to allow the building structure to dry, and to provide access to the roof and protection during the repair work, a roofed and enclosed scaffolding was erected over Cormac's Chapel.

"This scaffold dominated the skyline over Cashel until

early this year and I know it was a source of much comment locally, but thankfully, we can all be happy that it did its job," Mr McMahon continued.

The commissioner also said eliminating a significant amount of water from the structure has ensured that the very precious wall paintings, which have now been professionally conserved, are preserved for future generations and can once again be viewed by visitors to the site. "The re-opening of Cormac's Chapel offers the visitor a really special treat. Tours of the Chapel are now available daily on a first-come, first-served basis with an extra flat-rate charge of €3.

"In order to continue to preserve the humidity levels within the Chapel, we have had to restrict access so daily visitor numbers will be limited," he added.

Funding announced for Tipperary Festival of Science

Tipperary events will receive funding to improve public understanding of science and technology, Fine Gael general election candidate Garret Ahearn says.

More than €470,000 has been invested nationally through Science Foundation Ireland (SFI) for organisations to host Science Week festivals or events during Science Week, which takes place from the November 11-18 this year.

This includes €35,000 for Tipperary Festival of Science, a collaboration between Mary Immaculate College, Limerick Institute of Technology and Tipperary County

Library Service. Events will be offered to children, teachers, families and the general public on the campuses of the partner organisations, libraries and schools.

"It's great that Tipperary is receiving funding to promote science. The study of science and technology is vital for driving our economy forward," Ahearn says.

"The European Commission recently announced that Ireland has moved up three places - to 6th from 9th - in the EU Digital Economy and Society Index (DESI) report for 2018 compared to 2017. This reflects improvements in basic and advanced digital

skills, online transactions and Irish people's use of internet services.

"This funding will further encourage our young people to get involved in science, and I encourage our communities to get involved in what will be the biggest science week yet.

"Fine Gael's action plan for education has committed to holding new summer courses in STEM subjects and industry placements for teachers. We want to deliver 20% increase in take up of students doing STEM for the Leaving Certificate and we are committed to delivering a 40% increase in female participation," he adds.

€124,700 FUNDING FOR TIPPERARY PLAYGROUNDS

Tipperary Fine Gael general election candidate Garret Ahearn says local children will benefit from €124,700 funding for playgrounds.

Gortnahoe Playground Group (€50,000), Drangan and Cloneen Community Playground Committee (€25,200), and Cloughjordan N.S (€49,500) are set to receive the funding from the CLÁR Programme.

"This is great news for children and families in our communities and will ensure they continue to enjoy high quality and safe playgrounds.

"At a time when outdoor

activities are often overlooked for hi-tech games, we must ensure our playgrounds and areas are exciting, and engaging for young minds. This funding will ensure our children enjoy state-of-the-art facilities here in Tipperary," Ahearn says.

OVER 1,100 PROJECTS

"Since 2016, the CLÁR Programme has provided funding to over 1,100 projects under various measures, including funding for 265 play and multi-use games area projects around the country.

"Communities themselves throughout Tipperary have fundraised and worked

with Tipperary County Council to put forward these projects for funding and this cooperation is to be acknowledged and welcomed.

"These projects are excellent examples of what can be done when everyone works together - resulting in new and improved recreational resources for children and communities in rural areas in Tipperary.

"This is a further testament to the passion and commitment of local communities to make rural Ireland and Tipperary a place where people want to live, work and prosper," he adds.

Bus links

A new local bus link in Co. Tipperary was launched in Brú Ború Heritage Centre recently for evening and night-time bus services linking Cashel and Cahir with villages for rural residents cut off from existing public transport.

Minister for Transport Shane Ross visited Cashel to officially launch the services.

Service 855 - T41 Tipperary Town to Cashel via Cahir: this regular/commuter style service links Tipperary Town, Cashel and Cahir along with the intervening villages of Bansha, New Inn, Golden and Kilfeacle. This service operates in a loop fashion allowing passengers to travel to and from the various villages and towns along the route and also serves Limerick Junction Train Station. Passengers need not book their seats as this service operates on a fixed route.

Service 488 - T41 Clonmel West DRT service: this is an expansion on an existing day time Demand Responsive Transport Service (DRT) provided through Ringalink, which allows passengers located towards the western rural environs of Clonmel to book a seat in order to travel to the various villages and towns that it serves. Passengers will be required to book their seat at least 24 hours in advance in order to travel. This service serves the areas of Ballyporeen, Burncourt, Clogheen, Ballylooby, Goatenbridge, Ardfinnan, Newcastle and Knocklofty and operates in a loop fashion allowing passengers to travel to and from the various villages and towns along the route, commencing and ending in

Clonmel.

Maxi Zoo's tips for pets on planes

Every year thousands of pets, mostly dogs and cats, fly away on holiday with their owners.

Information about transport regulations and costs can be obtained directly from your airline. It is important that you book and register your pet within plenty of time, as only a limited number of animals may travel per flight. Many airlines only transport animals in the luggage hold, while others allow for them in the cabin.

In the luggage hold

Pets that cannot travel in the cabin due to their size and weight go in the luggage hold, where there are special air-conditioned areas. Your four-legged friend will travel in a flight-

box, with a water dish, which must comply with international regulations (IATA Live Animal Regulations) for the transport of animals. When purchasing the box make sure it complies with these standards. Your animal must be able to comfortably lie, stand, sit, turn around and stretch inside it. The box must be sturdy, waterproof,

permeable to air and escape-proof. Many airlines calculate the weight of the animal including the box as baggage or excess baggage.

Travelling in the cabin

Pets with a maximum weight of five to eight kilograms (including transport box) can travel in the cabin, depending on the airline.

Special flight bags or boxes made of plastic are available at your local Maxi Zoo. Ideally the boxes have vents or bars on the sides.

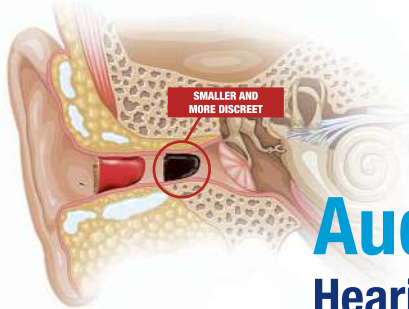

Discovering BATS

The welcome cool of the evening finds the whole family sitting on deckchairs out the front of the house.

As dusk starts to settle, the first insects start to gather around the aging streetlight that has lit up my house for the last 30 years. They are soon joined by a few fluttering moths, but these are not the main attraction tonight. Recently it was proposed to install a brighter light, but thankfully funding fell short and I can still enjoy the dark and discovering its hidden wildlife.

I was holding my bat detector, converting the calls of the bats into a sound that we could hear. Each species of bat calls at a different frequency, and combined with flight pattern and habitat you can generally tell the species of bat. As with any study in the natural world, there are always calls that remain a mystery.

The kids wandered in and out and find a better use for the bat detector. They realised that it can make an amazing range of noises, when they munch a packet of crisps or scratch a nylon surface. There fun was only broken by the first clicks on the detector, as a bat emerges from its roost to feed.

We stared at the light and soon saw our first bat. The bats flight was quick and erratic, and after a few checks on the detector we identified the bat as a soprano pipistrelles. They come to feed around the light for years, but I have yet to discover where they are roosting. All that flight needs plenty of fuel, and they will devour up to 3,500 insects throughout the night. This is an important pest control service, and when their tummies are full the females will return to their roost to suckle their pup.

They also have one baby each summer and are careful to pick the best maternity roosts. It needs to be warm and dry but with no draughts or strong lighting. Our attics make the perfect roost and they can squeeze in through the smallest gaps. After the



summer they generally move out to cooler and dryer places to hibernate for the winter.

Bats can create a little mess, but a sheet of plastic spread on the floor will collect any droppings and these can be removed at least once a week. Bats are fully protected by law and it is illegal to disturb them at their roosts. You can still carry out works, but this is dependent on the species of bat and roost size. Bat conservation website has very good advice on bats in the home.

At a recent bat training event we found a mother and pup that had fallen out of the roost. The lady leading the bat is qualified to handle bats, but I had never been so close to a bat before. Every detail was visible and we were all talking in hushed but excited tones. The pup continued to feed while all this drama was going on, and I was surprised at how big it was compared to its mother.

A ladder was quickly found and the family returned to the roost. Male bats roost in different locations but the sexes can feed together. Bats have a neat strategy to avoid competition while feeding together. They can change their echolocation calls and this allows them to hunt different insects. Larger prey like a moth are sometimes taken to a convenient perch to be eaten. If you find a place with lots of discarded wings, this would be a good spot to observe.

Other common species of bats are Leisler's. These are large bats compared to the pipistrelles. Leisler's are early risers and are out while

it is still bright. This often leads to confusing with swifts, but the birds sweeping wings helps tell it apart from a bat.

Leisler's have a direct a powerful flight and need a larger space to turn so their flight is more deliberate. They will also roost up high as they need a long drop before being able to fly.

Over the water you will find daubenton's. They have large feet that they use to gather insects just above the surface of a pond or river. Their calls are a series of rapid clicks that are compared to a machine gun.

Bats are fascinating to watch and can reveal quiet intimate behaviour. I was recently observing two bats and they were actively feeding and calling. Suddenly all went quiet and the bats briefly touched before continuing on their way.

We can help bats by leaving more areas of flowers filled grassland in our gardens and through tidy town's projects that will attract insects. This will also feed swallows and other insect eating birds.

Keeping our cats in an hour before and after dusk helps bat. As they emerge from their roost they are vulnerable to a waiting cat. Over the years I have gotten a few presents of a tattered bat.

Protection from Elder Abuse

Elder abuse has been in the news regularly over the last month following the news of the treatment of a 75-year-old lady who suffers from dementia.

This story comes on the back of World Elder Abuse Day and is a timely reminder of the vulnerability of the elderly.

Abuse of the elderly can be either emotional, physical or financial. Whilst physical abuse is easier to prove, reports suggest that financial abuse is on the rise.

Lynch Solicitors has been involved in a number of cases where parents are seeking protection from adult children. A parent can seek either a Safety Order or a Barring Order, both of which we explain briefly below.

SAFETY ORDER

A Safety Order does not remove the perpetrator from the home. It allows the perpetrator to visit the house or indeed to stay in the house if they are living there.

What a Safety Order does

is to direct a person to not commit any acts of violence or threaten or put their parent in fear. If they do such acts, then the Gardaí can be called and it translates into a criminal matter with a risk of a criminal record.

A Safety Order can be granted for up to five years. But more often than not, they are granted for two to three years.

BARRING ORDER

Unlike a Safety Order, a Barring Order removes the perpetrator from the home. It does not allow the perpetrator to visit the house or stay in the house if they are living there.

Like a Safety Order, it can direct that a person not commit any acts of violence or threaten or put their parent in fear.

If they do such acts, then the Gardaí can be called, and it then translates into a criminal matter with a risk of a criminal record.

A Barring Order can be granted up to three years. If

the parent wants to get a Barring Order against a child, the parent has to own the house or have a greater interest in the house than the child. So while you might have a parent and a child living in a house, they can not bar that person from a house which they own.

ENDURING POWER OF ATTORNEY

Another type of abuse that we see is financial abuse.

An Enduring Power of Attorney is a document that allows an individual to choose to appoint a specific individual, usually a close family member, to look after both your personal and financial affairs in the event that for any reason you lose your mental capacity in the future.

This is one of the best ways of placing yourself in the care of someone capable who you can trust.

BACKGROUND

school children 2.5 to 6 years old and is a fundamental starting point for children's cycling and an excellent opportunity to promote active lifestyles for physical activity and is fundamental in the process to learning to ride at the earliest possible age.

The programme incorporates fun activities that help children develop gross motor skills spatial awareness, bilateral co-ordination and enhance their physical literacy. Upon completion of the programme children transition more easily to riding a pedal bicycle in a safe environment.

The programme combines balance bikes with a variety of fun activities that build confidence, spatial awareness and dynamic bal-



ance skills that enable children to cycle without ever needing stabilisers.

Tipperary Childcare Committee Limited was established following the merger of North and South Tipperary Childcare Committees in 2015.

Childcare Committees implement national childcare programmes and policies at a local level.

Tipperary Childcare Committee is managed by a voluntary board of directors, selected from a broad range

of stakeholders with experience in the community and childcare sectors.

The office is located at the Civic Offices building in Friar Street, Cashel.

Currently there are eight staff located at the office who provide information, supports and advice to parents, Childminders, Parent & Toddler Groups and to childcare providers on all aspects of running a quality early years'

service.

The Childcare Committee is a central hub of information and support for parents and early years' providers throughout the county.

Staff support the implementation of the childcare funding schemes including the Free Pre-School Year.

The single affordable childcare scheme was introduced in September 2017, this scheme will be further developed over the next year or so. Officials from the Department of Children and Youth Affairs and Pobal are currently working on the development of the IT, Legislative and administrative infrastructure needed to fully roll out the scheme which will be designed to be more user friendly for both parents and early years providers.

The targeted subsidies are available for children aged from 6 months up to 15 years of age. The universal subsidy is payable for children between the ages of 6 and 36 months (or until the child qualifies for the free pre-school programme if later) who are availing of childcare at a TUSLA registered childcare service.

The universal subsidy is not means-tested and is available for families at any income level.
