Support cycle in memory of a great man who loved helping others

A Carrick-on-Suir man is encouraging people across Tipperary to support his late father's commemorative cycle this weekend.

Carrickbeg's Evin Power says his late father, Bobby, was a great man who loved cycling and helping others.

Bobby - the father of Evin, Conor, Cian and Deirdre, and married to Margaret - worked at the Tannery in Carrick-on-Suir and was distribution manager at Bulmers in Clonmel.

But Bobby was best known for cycling, winning over 100 senior races for his club Carrick Wheelers Cycling Club, his county and country.

"Dad was a very successful cyclist. Irish cyclists have a special affinity with Rás Tailteann, a week long international cycling stage race that is considered Ireland's premier race. Dad rode this race 18 times, winning six stages - a record for a Tipperary rider," Evin tells South Tipp Today.

Evin fondly remembers family holidays with his father, in particular a trip of a lifetime to Disneyland Florida, playing darts against each other at home, travelling to Tipperary matches and even the little things like having breakfast together at the weekend.

But Bobby's kind nature extended outside of the family home. The 2018 Bobby Power Commemorative Cycle, which takes place in Carrick-on-Suir on Sunday 9th September, will be in aid of the Irish Pilgrimage Trust,

an organisation very close to Bobby's heart before he passed away in May 2011 after a long battle with illness.

"It's for a great cause and will allow local children who are unwell to travel to Lourdes. When Dad was approached for cycling training advice by locals who were preparing for the Irish Pilgrimage Trust fundraising cycleto Lourdes he decided to take part himself on many occasions. In 2009, he completed the cycle while in remission from cancer which says all you need to know about Bobby Power," Evin proudly recalls.



Top talent will rock Gleesons in support of Emma Lacey

GLEESONS IN CLONMEL will rock to the beat of some of the best bands in the country to support a 23 year-old local woman battling brain and spinal conditions.

Clonmel Band Aid will be held in Gleesons on Sunday 9th September to support Emma Lacey, who has just undergone brain surgery and is waiting to have her sixth spinal surgery in as many years.

The first event of its kind was held last year to support Clonmel man Evan Hickey, who needed life-saving brain surgery, and Gleesons proprietor Richie Gleeson wanted to do it again.

"Evan's dad Joe inspired me last year, and it was very moving how the people of

Clonmel came out to support the Hickey family.

"Joe made me aware of the difficult challenges facing Emma and we all wanted to do it again," said Richie.

An incredible line-up of bands is already secured including The Pearly Whites, Thank Funk, Super Soul Machine, The Waheys and The Papa Zitas and huge crowds are expected for the day, with music on two stages, starting at 1pm.

It was Alan McCormack of The Pearly Whites who was instrumental in getting such an event off the ground last year. He went to school with Evan Hickey and when he rang around all of his friends in the bands were more than willing to help.

"There was absolutely no hesitation last year from all of the bands and the same again this year, because the cause is such a worthy one. It is one of the best lineups you would see," said Alan.

Joe Hickey said the event last year in Gleesons for Evan showed the incredible goodwill of the people of Clonmel and beyond and he was delighted to support a similar event to help out Emma.

Very attractive prizes on the day include a smart TV, and Rory at Gleesons has secured weekends away in Birmingham, Dublin and Sligo for the event.

Paudie Everard, chairman of The Emma Lacey Trust, said they greatly appreciated the support shown by Gleesons, the Hickey family, all of the musicians and everybody involved that are preparing for the day.

Second chance at Leaving Cert proves a real winner for students

Summer Davis from Clonmel left school at the age of 16 without completing the Leaving Cert and in the years since then had three children which meant returning to education would become ever more daunting.

But she was one of those opening an envelope containing the results of that fateful exam and is now going on to third-level, a prospect which seemed unlikely all those years ago when she quit school.

It's thanks to the Vocational Training Opportunities Scheme (VTOS) that she was able to return to education two years ago, resume classes and sit seven subjects in the Leaving last May.

"I would highly recommend it," she told South Tipp Today. "Michael Corbett [VTOS co-ordinator] is a trojan worker, I don't think anyone could ever replace

Her children are now aged four, two and one and she was able to put them in the creche when she took up her VTOS studies, every morning until she was finished classes that evening - "without that I wouldn't have been able to do it" - which gave her peace of mind.

"It was tough, but I loved it," she said of the course. "At the end of the day you have got homework to do while you have other responsibilities outside of school, and I also had one child in junior in-

"Certain things happen, there are different obstacles along the way, but when I was there I paid attention and I did what I had to do."

She was "very happy" with her results, which would have been one A and the rest B's and C's under the previous marking scheme, and is now training in massage therapy and personal training at Level 5 on the national qualifications framework, with more options set to open up for her because of her Leaving Cert.

Also in this year's VTOS group of seven was Tomás Roche from Carrick-on-Suir, who did six Leaving Cert sub-jects after completing the two-year course.


"I actually went to do it about three times before, but just kind of left it. Being young, you don't want to be going back to school. But it was good. Great craic. I knew no-one when I came in but got on with everyone. It's ideal, you're not treated like a kid

and if you want to learn you will learn and if you don't you won't."

Co-ordinator Corbett said everyone involved was pleased with their results, with some planning to continue their education and others back at work. "We had people in their 20s, 30s, 40s. In September we have 11 coming into sixth year."

The VTOS programme still has connections with the "old tech" on The Mall in Clonmel, but much of the activity takes place across the road in the former army barracks, which lends more space for classes and a canteen.

"It is a great achievement for an adult to complete a two-year full-time educational programme considering that they are normally leading busy lives and have other responsibilities such as caring for children or other family members," Michael Corbett said.



Supercar spectacle to take in stunning Tipperary scenery

The official route for Cannonball 2018 has been announced, but on a recent recce trip organisers were so taken with the spectacular Vee Drive from Tipperary into Waterford that they have now rerouted the event to take in the world famous drive and showcase it to their international participants.

The Vee Drive is one stunning vista after another as this leisurely loop unfolds.

The Cannonball run - the supercar spectacle that raises funds for vital charities will take in the towns of Ballyporeen and Clogheen as they embark on the Vee Drive from Tipperary into Water-

The Vee is predominantly

taking panoramic views going through the pass. The journey rises to about 2,000 feet above sea level and as it does so it will give wonderful views to the Cannonball drivers and visitors of a portion of the Golden Vale of Tipperary between the Knockmealdown and Galtee Mountain

On a clear day the Vee affords views along and across the valley to Clonmel, Cahir, Ardfinnan, Clogheen, Ballyporeen and even Cashel. You can also see the Galtee Mountains across the valley, the Comeragh Mountains along the valley and Slievenamon behind Clonmel quite clearly.

Cannonball has always had a huge welcome in Tipperary and a driving force for Cannonball over the last 10 vears is New Inn's John McHugh. John has been a pivotal force in generating the €960,000 already raised for Irish charities on Cannonball and this year will almost certainly break the €1,000,000 milestone.

Michael Ryan of Donal Ryan Motors, Thurles, has provided John with the new Nissan X Trail and Mark Strang of Strang Motors Kilsheelan has kindly provided the brand new Peugeot 5008 GT as crew cars for John's hard working team. Tipp is at the top once more!

Boston Scientific make "substantial investment in Clonmel site's future"

US healthcare multinational Boston Scientific has welcomed the planning approval it has received from Tipperary County Council to build a large extension to its Clonmel facility, with 155 extra car parking spaces.

The company, however, says the proposed expansion doesn't relate to any specific

announcement of extra jobs at the plant.

The manufacturer of healthcare equipment including pacemakers and defibrillators has secured planning permission to build a two-storey administration block extension at its facility on Clonmel's Cashel Road.

The 3,200 square-metre building will range in height from 9.1 metres to 12.6

The County Council also granted permission for 155 new car parking spaces adjacent to the existing car park in the south-western corner of the site.

Permission has also been given for 15 new motorcycle parking spaces, 15 bicycle parking spaces and an alteration to 13 existing car parking spaces to provide eight accessible parking spaces.

The planning application states that all access to the site will be through the existing access roads off the Cashel Road.

The planning permission granted for the project is only conditional, as an appeal can be lodged with An Bord Pleanala for up to a month after the date of the decision. Full permission will be granted this month if no appeal is lodged.

In a statement, Boston Scientific said it was delighted to receive planning permission for the expansion of its Clonmel site to "support existing and potential manufacturing and supply chain

capacity".

"Whilst this expansion does not relate to any specific job announcement, we are

very positive about this substantial investment in the site's future," said the com-

If the grant of planning permission is not appealed to An Bord Pleanala, Boston Scientific plans to start work on the extension at the end of this year and complete it by 2019.





Timmy explained to the group that the organic garden installed a pond, as part of their overall efforts, to increase nature in the garden. Also it has benefits for mental health, creating a calming and relaxing place to sit, and escape the stresses of modern life.

Over 80% of ponds have disappeared from the landscape, and gardens and communities are now a very important refuge, for many aquatic species. In a survey by the Irish peatland conservation council, members of the public were asked to report sightings of frogs. Over 60% of records were from garden

We started off in the round room, by having a brief look inside the moth trap. As part of the tidy town's biodiversity section, we are doing a moth survey in the garden. We had run the trap over the weekend, and we were not disappointed with the results. While it was very $tempting \, to \, stay \, and \, examine$ the moths, we headed outside to the pond, while the weather was dry.

The pond was finished this summer, but will take a few years for an aquatic water community to develop. Already life has moved in, and we watched as pond skaters glided across the surface of the water. These predators sense the vibrations of insects struggling in the water, and home in for their dinner.

Other creatures like water boatmen will fly in, and hopefully next year the pond will be christened with some frog

spawn. Timmy explained that to keep your pond healthy you need to include oxygenator's plants. Vegetation around the edges is also important. Insects like damselfly spent most of their lives in the water, but pupate into an adult, on waterside vegeta-

Nasturtiums are in flower, and we find for aging common carder bumblebees and buff tailed queens. Teasels will have tall spikey heads next year that will packed full of seeds for birds.

Water is essential for life, and even a pond a couple of meters wide will attract wildlife. It is also important to gentle grade the sides. If the bank is to steep nocturnal creatures like hedgehogs that are naturally good swim-mers, will find it very hard to climb out. Use rain water rather than tap to fill up your pond as this is untreated.

If you have small kids you can create a bog garden. This takes advantage of any natural wet area in your garden, and can be planted up with flowers like meadow sweet, willowherbs, flag iris and even willow.

The rain returned, and we headed back into the round room, and handed out an information sheet to all participants around "how to create your own pond".

Inside the moths have waited long enough, and we opened the trap and start putting the moths into bug containers. Now that autumn is here, the colours of the moths start to reflect the autumnal colours. We catch a lot of square spot rustics, and one beautiful central barred swallow moth. It is a subtle yellow colour, with a wide

Moths are really important creatures, from their unseen role in pollination, to food for bats and birds.

Native trees like willow, hawthorn, blackthorn, dogwood, hazel and crab apple are the food plants for a wide range of moth caterpillars. Timmy plans to grow some honeysuckle that releases its scent at dusk and attracts

We finish up with a tour of the garden and vegetables, fruits and herbs are ready for harvesting. I loved the taste of the yellow raspberries, and the tomatoes freshly plucked from the vine are delicious.

Apples are having a good season, and any that fall to the ground, will be eaten by birds, animals and insects.

A brilliant afternoon learning around how to create your own pond and moths, and thanks to all who attended, and to Timmy for sharing his knowledge.

WHAT IS NARCOLEPSY?

Narcolepsy is the second leading cause of excessive daytime sleepiness.

By early 2010 it was evident that the swine flu pandemic was much less lethal than had been predicted by the World Health Organization and its scientific advisors.

By the end of 2010, swine flu had ceased to occupy the attention of the world's news media and the 'pandemic' was described in the scientific press as "a damp squib" and as "the swine flu scam".

To meet anticipated demand when talks of a pandemic were at their peak, some manufacturers added a chemical booster to their product to speed up the manufacturing process, notwithstanding well-publicised concerns regarding the safety of these boosters. The chemical used in the Pandemrix ASo3 Vaccine had not been properly tested in children; its safety having been trialed primarily on healthy adults aged 18-60.

The Irish government came to an agreement with the manufacturers of swine flu vaccines that they would carry the legal risks in the event of patients experiencing any vaccine-related harms.

The vaccine first began to raise major concerns in Europe after revelations that the vaccine accidentally tricked the immune system into mistaking a chemical signal the body naturally sends to the brain to assist in regulating sleep for the swine flu virus.



Carrick-on-Suir's Meals on Wheels service, which was based at the Parish Hall, was forced to close in August due to increased insurance costs, health specifications and a continued increase in the cost of raw materials.

This new group is planning to change the Meals on Wheels system while still offering the same service to citizens who need it in the town. The group hopes to resume the service as soon as pos-

sible.

"The handful of volunteers who kept the Meals on Wheels service going for so long in the town are to be praised for their perseverance and dedication," said a spokesperson for the new Meals on Wheels group.

"They never looked for credit or acclaim as they went about their work. It is felt by this current group that the least that can be done to show respect to a great organisation is to assist them in paying off their debts."

Phenomenal success for brothers in top motorcycle racing championship

Tipperary based brothers
Ian and Michael Prendergast
have achieved success in
Ireland's biggest motorcycle
racing championship series the Dunlop Masters Superbike Championship series after just two years of racing experience.

The race series is run each year in Mondello Park from March to September and the Prendergast brothers are among the top performing competitors in this year's championships.

Ian has won the Masters Pre-Injection 600 Championship title after winning the penultimate race in the series on Saturday, August 25. During the race, he broke the lap record which had stood for five years. He also won the MCUI Southern Champion-

ship title the following day at Mondello having clocked up a total of 400 points - 125 points higher than the second placed rider.

His younger brother Michael, meanwhile, is in 3rd place in the top ten positions of his class in the Dunlop Masters Superbike Cup Championship with his 1000cc bike. He set a personal best time of 1:45.1 second in his first race on Saturday, August 25.

Despite crashing in his first race the following day, he finished second in the last race of the day. Michael says it's still all to play for in the final race weekend at the end of September as there is only 7.5 points between the top three riders.

Ian and Michael are originally from Piltown but now live in Carrick-on-Suir. They are electricians by trade, who re-

pair domestic appliances in Carrick-on-Suir and its hinterland. They are passionate about their motorbike racing, but only took up the sport in the past three years.

Michael's wife Róisin, who accompanies them to all the races, bought him a Motorbike Training Day' in Donnington, England, for Christmas a few years ago and in July 2015 both Michael and Ian travelled to the event.

The brothers' skill and potential was recognised at the training day and they have never looked back since. "It gave us the gee up to go on the racing circuit," says Michael.

Now after only two years of racing, Ian and Michael are fast rising on the platform of up and coming motorbike racers. They love every minute of the sport - the

thrill, the adrenaline and the buzz that lasts for a week after each weekend of championship racing.

When the bikes are put away for six months after the racing season, Ian and Michael continue to keep fit by training in the gym, cycling and healthy eating. They do all the repair work on their bikes as keeping them maintained is a huge expense, especially replacing the tyres which can cost up to €500 a week during the racing series.

The brothers thank Niall Derby from Carrick and Paddy Curran, an ex-racer from Owning, who accompany them to the championship races and advise and help them with the bikes and pit boards.

Two local soccer players are feeling proud after being selected for the Republic of Ireland under 13 squad for the upcoming Actavo Cup in Dublin.

Cappoquin Railway Football Club's Ronan Mansfield, who has strong Carrick-on-Suir roots, and Tipperary Town club St Michael's star central defender Conor Martin will join 16 other rising soccer stars on the Football Association of Ireland's (FAI) under 13 emerging talent programme international team.

Ronan started playing for Cappoquin FC at the age of six, a shining young talent that progressed onto the West Waterford East Cork (WWEC) Development Squad within four years. With WWEC, Ronan gained invaluable experience playing in the Cover Cup 2015 and 2016, the Mare Nostrum Cup 2016 in

Spain, the Manchester International Cup 2017, the Kennedy Cup 2018, and the Galway Cup 2017 and 2018. Last year, Ronan was se-

lected to join the South East Emerging Talent gramme, and months later made the cut for the South East Centre of Excellence.

Ronan says dedication, hard work, a healthy diet and support from family and friends has helped him progress through the ranks at underage. "It means underage. everything to me getting selected. We do a lot of tactical training and play a different way with the South East Centre of Excellence here in Waterford. I do a load of different exercises at home and follow a programme that the coaches gave us. Foam rolling, stretching and relaxing keep me on top of my game," motivated left-back tells South Tipp Ronan Today.

Ronan got called for trials with the FAI under 13 Republic of Ireland Development Squad in March, and in June was selected to train

with a squad of 50 Republic of Ireland players over a three week period.

Ronan started training with Waterford FC's under 15 team in recent weeks, having received notification that he will be representing his country at the Actavo Cup in Cherry Orchard, Dublin, from September 14-16.

"It has been a really good few weeks for me and I cannot wait to play against all the big teams in the Actavo Cup. We are training well as a team and it's great getting to know the other players because we are all from different parts of Ireland. We have a great team and are looking forward to testing ourselves against the best teams. If you said to me when I started playing soccer that I would get the chance to represent Waterford and Ireland, I would have given you one of my fingers for it," he

St Michael's Conor Martin is relishing competing in a competition which includes teams such as Liverpool,

Aberdeen Swansea City. His side will open the tournament against St Patrick's Athletic on Friday 14th September at 4:30pm, followed by games in Group 2 against Glasgow Celtic and Newcastle United.

Similar to Ronan, Conor started playing with his local club at the age of six before progressing through the ranks. His form with the Tipperary Emerging Talent team warranted a place on the Waterford Regional squad.

He overcame the rigorous trials with the FAI under 13 Republic of Ireland Development Squad and is thrilled to be selected to represent Tipperary and Ireland at the Actavo Cup. "Conor is a very good, committed player with a great attitude. For a central defender he is very comfortable on the ball," says St Michael's schoolboy secretary John Cremins.

"It's fantastic for a player of his age to get recognised at national level and it's also brilliant for the club. We are very proud of him," he adds.


