Clonmel Parkinson's device gives man new lease of life

A life-changing device for people with Parkinson's disease and other movement disorders is being created at Boston Scientific Clonmel.

Deep Brain Stimulation (DBS) involves implanting electrodes in certain areas of the brain.

The treatment comprises

of a stimulator or implantable pulse generator (IPG) being surgically inserted under the skin, usually just below the collarbone. The IPG produces small electrical signals which pass along fine wires - known as leads - positioned in the subthalamic nucleus, a small lens-shaped nucleus in the brain.

Boston Scientific Clonmel is the only site within the Boston Scientific network that manufactures neuromodulation IPGs, as per the ones used in DBS. More than 5,000 DBS devices are made in Clonmel every year by a team of up to 130 people. These DBS devices are also used to treat other neurological conditions including essential tremor, dystonia, epilepsy, Tourette syndrome, chronic pain and obsessive compulsive disorder.

"Movement disorders associated with Parkinson's disease, dystonia and essen-

tial tremor can significantly impair daily living and the quality of life of those affected. There is no cure for movement disorders but their symptoms can be managed. In many patients, control of symptoms by medications diminishes with time," a Boston Scientific spokesperson tells South Tipp Today.

Karen opens up about losing her husband to pancreatic cancer

A heartbroken Tipperary mother has opened up about losing her husband to pancreatic cancer this month.

The late Garda Sergeant Martin Hopkins, a father of three young children and married to Clonmel's Karen Ferris, had been fighting pancreatic cancer since July

. Garda colleagues formed a guard of honour as the funeral cortege made its way the streets of Clonmel, following requiem mass at St Mary's Church on November 16.

Based in Clonmel, a fit and healthy Martin was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer at the age of 39.

But despite Martin's

battle, Karen never gave up hope as the disease progressed. "Because the reality is that no matter how much you understand the low chance of survival, or eventually adjust to a terminal diagnosis, you never give up hoping," Karen said.

"I spent my nights re-searching innovative treatments, wondering how we might fund a trip to the States, worked with our oncologist to explore how to get him on a clinical trial in Belfast and followed Vicky Phelan's journey with immunology wondering if this could offer some hope of fighting back," she continued.

Karen only accepted that Martin was dying while sitting by his bed in his final days at Marymount Hospice in Cork. Karen wanted to see Martin's pain and suffering come to an end, but she is not at peace with how pancreatic cancer ravaged a healthy man's life so quickly and how it offered little opportunities for positive outcomes all the way through.

Recalling Martin's first

diagnosis in July 2017, Karen said he started to turn jaundice and while the GP suspected hepatitis, medical tests at Cork's Bon Secours Hospital revealed a mass blocking his liver. "We lived for a few days hoping it may be gallstones, before an analysis of a tissue sample confirmed cancer. We met a surgeon a few days later who gave us the frightening news Martin's tumour looked like it was attached to a portal vein, meaning surgery was only possible if they could shrink it back," Karen re-

The family spent months in limbo when further scopes proved inconclusive. "Eventually in October, after another CT scan which indicated the tumour was likely to be in a hard to reach part of the pancreas, we had to decide to take the risk of starting treatment without a fully positive biopsy. We started treatment," she said.

Karen described the devastating moment she found out her husband's cancer had spread. "While the treatment was successful in reducing the tumour, the cancer had started to spread by the time we got to surgery in May of

"The best hope was a complicated surgical procedure to remove part of the pancreas and the tumour. After nine months of very aggressive chemotherapy and then a course of radiotherapy to reduce the tumour, we got the good news that he was finally a candidate for this surgery- - the Whipple. The tumour had shrunk away from the portal vein enough to enable the surgeon to attempt the procedure. It was a seven hour operation and all the potential risks and side effects were outlined to me: death on the operating table, a spread to the lymph nodes and not being able to remove the tumour because of where

"The possibility of the cancer having spread to the other organs was not really considered as nothing had been picked up in CT scans prior to surgery. So it was devastating to get the call that they had found two tiny white spots in his liver during surgery and they had come back as cancerous. It was even more devastating to be the person an hour later who was there at his side when he opened his eyes in recovery and gave me a thumbs up,

only for me to have to shake my head with tears in my eyes and respond with a thumbs down. But that's the impact of pancreatic cancer, the absolute crucifying blow to families who have to live with the consequences of this 'environmental' cancer. The spread of the cancer meant we had no hope."

Karen detailed adjusting Martin's terminal diagnosis and how the family got on with life. "Martin recovered from surgery well

enough to make it home for his son's First Holy Communion a week later, while we adto a terminal diagnosis. When we returned for a follow up scan in August, they indicated it had spread to the liver and the colon, and despite starting another round of chemotherapy he started to deteriorate rap-

"Despite what feels now like way too short a time, our last 18 months have not all been about cancer and this

fight. Life goes on, particularly when you have three young children. It's about birthdays and milestones at school, and cups of coffee, and getting a game of golf on occasion or buying a new bike even if he did only get to ride it about three times.

While on treatment, a determined Martin underwent two rounds of interviews and was made garda sergeant last month, "It was a real source of pride in his final days. It was about truly learning the meaning of good friends and how important family really are to keeping the show on the road, and also about hospitals and all the amazing staff who become much more than health sector workers when they are by your bed night and day in your darkest days."

Married to Cavan native Martin the past 12 years, Karen shared the family's struggle to shine a light on the "cruel disease" for Pancreatic Awareness Month. "Two tiny white spots, less than two millimetres each, that's what the surgeon said. Two tiny white spots that made all the difference in our lives. The difference between hope and despair, between a possible chance at a future and no future at all, between watching him survive cancer and watching him die from

"It is one of the worst cancers out there - the stats aren't good. It is the only major cancer with a single digit survival rate. Just nine per cent of people with pancreatic cancer will live five years with beyond diagnosis.

"I know so many other families have gone through and continue to go through losing a loved one to cancer.

"This month seeks to raise awareness of pancreatic cancer and I want to shine a spotlight on the painful legacy so we may one day start to change this story for another family," she added.

Proposal to link up greenways The creation of a gre-

enway connecting Carrickon-Suir with the popular Waterford to Dungarvan Greenway has been proposed as a way of boosting Carrick-on-Suir's tourism industry.

Under the proposal, part of the greenway route would follow an old track linking The Navigation on the Suir near Carrick-on-Suir with the Curraghmore Estate in Portlaw, County Waterford.

Carrick-on-Suir cillor David Dunne, who put forward the idea at the October meeting of Carrick-on-Suir Municipal District, said the path to the River Suir through Curraghmore Woods was created by a former Lord Waterford in case he needed to make a quick getaway.

A riverside walkway from Dillon Bridge to The Navigation already exists but is overgrown and would need to be developed.

He revealed there is already a move to link the Curraghmore Estate with the Waterford Greenway.

He informed councillors that Portlaw based councillor's motion promoting a proposal to develop a greenway linking Curraghmore Estate with the Waterford Greenway was passed at a meeting of Comeragh Municipal District.

Cllr Dunne said connecting Carrick-on-Suir with the Waterford to Dungarvan Greenway would extend Carrick-on-Suir's tourist industry and argued it was "well worth looking at".

Carrick-on-Suir cipal District Director Pat Slattery said his advice was for a community group to be formed to put forward the proposal and seek funding first for a feasibility study through LEADER and at a later stage for the development of the greenway.

He pointed out that LEADER was struggling to spend the budget it had on rural environment projects.



Minister McHugh urged to consider Tipperary schools campaign

The national president of St.Vincent de Paul Kieran Stafford has called on the Minister for Education Joe McHugh to provide extra resources to five Tipperary town primary schools.

He said the five schools - St. Joseph's, Gaelscoil Tiobraid Arann, St. Michael's GNS, The Monastery CBS and St. Michael's Junior Boys School - had a "valid" request for DEIS support and called on the new minister to grant the status.

The choir of one of the five Tipperary schools, St. Joseph's, engaged in a battle for DEIS status were invited to take part in the St. Vincent de Paul national launch of their 2018 appeal in Dublin with Ryan Tubridy this month.

The following day the schools principals met Minister McHugh in Dublin to discuss DEIS status. They were informed that any further roll-out of the DEIS scheme would not be until spring 2019.

Kieran Stafford said there were serious levels of disadvantage in Tipperary town and the case for providing additional supports through DEIS was very strong. "I have supported the long running campaign for St. Joseph's and other Tipperary town schools to be granted DEIS as the need for it is abundantly obvious.

"Despite the fact the Department of Education changed the DEIS assessing model in 2017, a move that

should have guaranteed that these schools would be successful, they are all still waiting. DEIS supports are vital if the pupils of schools experiencing disadvantage are to have an equal right to fulfil their potential as citizens of our country," said the Clonmel-based national president of St. Vincent de Paul.

He called on Minister McHugh to examine and grant Tipperary town's valid request for the approval of DEIS support for it's schools. "If we want to break the cycle of poverty that affects 140,000 children in Ireland today, then one way to achieve this is to make sure they all have equal access to

education," insisted Kieran Stafford.

Kieran Stafford said the focus of the national campaign this year was on children who are in poverty. "It was great to have the pupils of St. Joseph's Tipperary town join us for the launch as we have been supporting their campaign with the other Tip-

perary town schools to be given DEIS status. Having DEIS status means that the school receives more resources to ensure that the pupils enjoy equal opportunities in the education system, giving them the chance to achieve their potential, something that every child in Ireland should be en-

titled to," he said.

Principal of St Joseph's Louise Tobin said it was an absolute honour to be invited to sing at the launch of the St. Vincent de Paul's Christmas Appeal. "It was a truly wonderful experience for the girls to sing in Dublin and support the great work of the St. Vincent de Paul," she added.

MINOR WORKS GRANT PAYMENT FOR 157 TIPPERARY SCHOOLS

Tipperary schools will receive a minor works grant payment over the coming days for small scale works and improvements.

The Department of Education is advising the 157 school authorities to use the grant to prioritise fire safety prevention works.

"This follows a commitment under Project Ireland 2040 that the minor works grant will be paid on an annual basis to all primary schools," welcomed Tipperary Fine Gael general election candidate Garret Ahearn.

"All primary schools will receive a flat rate minor works grant of €5,500 plus €18.50 per mainstream pupil and €74 per special needs pupil attending a special school or special class. The grant is worth €6,425 for a 50 pupil school and over €11,000 for a 300 pupil school."

While schools have discretion under the minor works grant scheme in relation to the nature of small scale works and improvements to be carried out to their school buildings, the department is advising all school authorities to use the grant in the first instance to prioritise fire safety prevention works.

"The key outcomes from the Department-led programme of fire safety assessments on 55 schools that was initiated last year highlights the need for a strengthened focus on fire safety housekeeping, maintenance and, where necessary, remedial works.

"The Department will be developing guidance for all primary and post-primary schools on the key issues identified from the fire safety assessment programme. This will focus on the importance of managing and prioritising fire safety, particularly in the context of funding provided under the minor works grant to all primary schools. It is envisaged that this guidance will be provided to schools in Q1 2019 and the department will be consulting with the school management bodies before finalising the guidance," Ahearn added.



"However. more than 120,000 people worldwide have already benefited from DBS, a brain stimulator that helps regulate neural signaling in the brain. Essentially, DBS is an implant in someone's brain by a neurologist. When the stimulation is switched on it helps with the tremors and shaking. DBS can have a hugely positive impact on the lives of people with conditions like Parkinson's disease," the spokesperson continues.

The facility in Clonmel

also manufactures the printed circuit board, electronic module and battery assemblies for the IPGs, in addition to the sterile packaging, finished product packaging and labelling, and the sterilisation and distribution of the devices.

Tipperary's Tony Ryan was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease at the age of 32 and has been living with the chronic neurological condition the past 30 years.

"Tony wasn't so much affected by the tremors. His biggest problem was muscle stiffness, which seriously affected his speech and walking," his wife Mary says.

Before Tony underwent DBS surgery, his Parkinson's was progressing and he was having to take up to 40 tablets a day. "The amount of medication was starting to make him more unwell and causing him to feel very sick. It was at this point our specialist started talking to us about DBS, which we had been told about previously, but at this stage it was felt that Tony was a good candidate for the surgery," Mary continues.

Following a three day assessment, Tony underwent surgery and DBS has since completely changed his life. "He has an optimistic frame of mind and with this and his stamina and ability to just get on with things, the doctors thought the DBS would work very well for him. So in January 2011 he had the DBS operation.



"Our abiding memory of this time is that Tony had the operation on the Wednesday and on Friday the stimulation was turned on. It was remarkable! Tony was able to walk up and down the corridor with no stiffness - it was incredible! We were home 10 days later and although the stimulation settings have needed some adjustments from time to time, we've really never looked back. "Tony is on half the medication he was on and we really are so grateful that he was able to have the DBS surgery," Mary adds.

Peacemaker hailed as visionary who ended conflict

The Tipperary International Peace Award was presented to the former President of Colombia Juan Manuel Santos at a ceremony in Tipperary town.

The former president and Nobel Laureate accepted the award - given in recognition of his efforts in bringing peace to Colombia and for the historic agreement that put an end to more than 50 years of fighting by the FARC guerrilla army - at a

ceremony in the Excel centre in Tipperary town.

The former president said he was honoured to be able to accept the Tipperary International Peace Award on behalf of all the victims of the conflict and the many that have worked tirelessly to bring about peace in Colombia. "Our duty and our responsibility is to unite. We are on the right path when we recognise all lives are as valued as one's own," said Juan Manuel Santos.

Eamon Gilmore, former

Labour leader and now EU special envoy to the Colombian peace process, said the suffered country had 220,000 deaths, 40,000 people were still missing and eight million people were displaced because of the conflict. Colombian peace, he said, would not have been achieved but for the vision of Juan Manuel Santos.

Peace Convention secretary Martin Quinn said it was appropriate to recognise the former president's efforts and vision for peace. "Juan Manuel Santos brought peace to his country through an agreement that put an end to more than 50 years of fighting, and has seen some 10,000 former fighters disarm and enter civilian life with 10 former FARC leaders taking their seats in Congress. He has left Colombia a much better and decidedly more peaceful country than when he assumed office," he added.

Top film director supports PAWS Animal Rescue

Oscar-nominated director Lenny Abrahamson is using his celebrity credentials to help boost the profile of a Tipperary animal shelter which is currently in over €40,000 worth of debt in veterinary bills.

PAWS Animal Rescue in Mullinahone currently cares for nearly 100 abandoned dogs of which 75 per cent are lurchers and sighthound breeds. Last month the charity received a veterinary bill for nearly €42,000 and this is expected to rise significantly again by Christmas.

After hearing about the shelters plight on social media, the talented filmmaker decided to visit the centre to help raise awareness of the work of the Tipperary charity, which has

been in operation since 2006.

"I love animals, I always have and I hope I can make a difference," said the What Richard Did director, who adopted his own lurcher named Jake earlier this year after immediately falling in love with the animal following a visit to the Dublin Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.

"There is a crisis of abandoned lurchers in this country at the moment," he said, adding that any stigma around racing breeds needs to end

"People think they need a lot of walking and they might be aggressive but that's not the case. These dogs make great family pets, they are very placid and once they get their run or walk in they are very content.

"They are gorgeous dogs and it's heartbreaking to see so many without homes, subjected to cruelty and abandoned."

Gina Hetherington of PAWS Animal Rescue said of the celebrity visit: "Lenny is a lovely person with a huge heart and we were delighted to welcome someone of his calibre to Mullinahone. We hope the public take note and start to look at adopting these animals as family pets,"

Abrahamson urged the public to support the rescue centre, which is largely dependent on charitable donations to cover its annual vet bill. "These smaller centres run by people like Gina need public support and I urge anyone thinking of making a charitable donation to think of places like PAWS," he added.

WILD ABOUT SOUTH TIPP

The welcome of Winter's Wildflowers

Wildlife Matters **Albert Nolan**



The hardy flowers of winter brighten up the dark days and also provide welcome sustenance for birds at lean times

uring the winter months, a few hardy flowers still grace our gardens and countryside.

While they lack the showy blooms of their summer cousins, they are often more appreciated, due to their scarcity. With no insects, around except for a few winter months, they have not evolved to attract in-

Getting out and about at this time of the year is so important, and fresh air and nature keep mind and body in good health. Once you wrap up well, the cold and wet are not too bad, and a hot shower and change of clothes once home, soon restores circula-

At the front of my house, I have been enjoying primrose for the last few weeks. I brought together all the scattered pots, to form one big display. This is right by the door of the house, and every morning as we leave, we are $greeted\,by\,an\,uplifting\,winter$ floral display. Regularly deadheading, the removal of old flowers, is extending their right December and hopefully

In the garden next door, the branches of a rampant Viburnum, stick out through the fence, and onto the path. They are covered in small creamy/pink flowers, and while not native, the local Housesparrows use it for shelter. Anytime I walk by, I can hear their continuous and loud chatter, coming from deep within the shrub. With the permission of the owner, I have taken a few cut-

tings for my own garden, and

this is a good time of the year

to take hardwood cuttings. Scattered along the edges of paths, are any piece of dis-turbed ground, the flowers of groundsel, brighten up the barren paths. It flowers throughout the year, but is easily controlled. The roots are shallow, and the plant can be pulled up with little effort. The seeds are eaten by finches, and I always leave a few for the birds.

Shepherds purse grows in similar places to groundsel, and it has small white flowers. The seed pods are heart shapped, and like the groundsel, it produces copious seeds, but again is easily dealt with. These are wildflowers of cultivation and waste ground, who life cycles needs to be short, to survive on this quickly changing world.

The daisy is so common, it is often completely ignored. It hugs the earth, and avoids the all too frequent lawn-mower. On wet days the flowers heads remain tightly closed, giving the plant its name of "day's eye". Early spring butterflies such as the small tortoiseshell like the daises open flowers that are full of pollen and nectar.

Chickweed is a flower of taller grass. It is a straggly plant that needs the support of the grasses. The flowers are white and tiny, but the leaves can be made into a refreshing winter salad, when combined with a zesty orange.

I was very surprised to find red dead nettle, with fresh pink flowers. This is one for the bees, but the mild

weather, and sheltered location, must have encouraged it to bloom. If there is seed, take a few, and scatter on top of a pot filled with old compost. If the compost is fresh, the seeds will not grow, as they don't thrive on fertile soil.

The bright yellow flowers of wild cabbage, make it easy to identify. Anyone who has had cabbages bolt, will be familiar with these flowers. The leaves when crushed also smell of cabbage, and don't have a bad taste.

Winter helitrope has also started to flower, and it wonderful vanilla scent, is very strong after rain or early morning. It spreads very easily, and if left to its own devices, will quickly take over and bed or border. The flowers are infertile, and it spreads by underground

Medical Negligence and how it can happen

WHAT IS MEDICAL **NEGLIGENCE?**

Medical Negligence at its simplest is an act or an omission by a health care professional which is below the accepted standard of care and results in injury or death to a natient.

HOW DOES MEDICAL **NEGLIGENCE OCCUR?**

Medical negligence can happen because of:

Diagnosis - i.e. misdiagnosis or delayed diagnosis;

Treatment - i.e. errors in the medical treatment such as incorrect medication, surgical errors, exposure to infection (MRSA etc) or;

Disclosure – i.e. failure to inform the patient of the risks of the treatment of pro-

DIAGNOSIS

Delayed Diagnosis

These types of cases usually occur when a Doctor or GP does not act in a timely manner.

If the patient suffers an injury because the medical professional did not take into account the patient's version of events or seriousness of their symptoms, then the patient may have a case for medical negligence.

In one example, the Supreme Court awarded damages where a casualty officer ignored a referral letter. The judge described this as an "inherently defective" practice and negligent.

Cancer Misdiagnosis Early detection is vital as it

enables timely medical treatment, and in many cases, the patient can be cured. There are unfortunately many cancer sufferers who are misdiagnosed as not having cancer.

Our experience in dealing with these cases shows that there are several reasons why a cancer misdiagnosis can occur - most of them as a result of human error or a lack of skill.

A doctor may not respond appropriately when a patient displays symptoms of cancer. There may be a failure to refer to a cancer specialist or a failure to appropriately monitor a patient who has a family history of cancer.

In a great number of cases that have come before the Courts it has been shown that laboratory results and scans are often misinterpreted by technicians.

TREATMENT

Failing to provide adequate staffing may lead to liability for medical negligence.

In one case, a patient had surgery to remove a tumour in their throat. On the second night after the surgery the tracheotomy tube was put out of place. By the time the airway passage was established the patient was brain dead. A case was brought on the grounds that the surgeon $\stackrel{\smile}{\text{allowed}}\,\text{the patient to recover}$ in ICU where there was noone trained to replace a tracheotomy tube.

The Court found that while this was the generally accepted medical practice in Ireland at the time, the failure to have someone in the ICU who was trained in the replacement of a tracheotomy tube, under the circumstances, was an "inherent defect". The surgeon was found guilty of negligence because the deceased would not have died if a trained person had been present in ICU.

DISCLOSURE

An example of a case due to a failure to disclose arose in 2000. The Plaintiff underwent bone graft for a dental implant procedure. Before the operation the practitioner told the plaintiff there was no guarantee unforeseen complications arise. However, he did not disclose that there was a risk of chronic neuropathetic pain which the patient subsequently suffered. The Courts found that the injury was a known and foreseeable consequence of damaging a nerve and that the standards of disclosure should be set by patients and not by doctors. Doctors must consider the likelihood and severity of the consequences prior to the



There is significant demand for hockey in Clonmel but the lack of facilities has been holding the club back from expanding for the last number of years," says club chairperson and coach Ger Boland.

The club has been steadily fundraising through table quizzes and cake sales, while in addition to the membership, fee members pay each week to train and play.

Ger says that the new pitch will require significant funding and it's hoped that $the \, people \, of \, the \, town \, and \, the \,$ local business community will continue to support fundraisers that will be organised for the coming months.

"This is a project that will benefit the whole of Clonmel, as almost any sport can be played on the proposed surface," says Ger.

"There isn't a multi- surface pitch of this size in Clonmel or the surrounding areas and demand is expected to be high, especially in the winter months.

With the prospect of securing a new pitch, Clonmel is looking forward to next season when they expect to have at least one additional team competing in the Munster Leagues, if not two.

As well as the high standard that's maintained by the senior team, the club's under 14s also enjoyed a very successful year, which culminated with their 4-3 extratime Munster final victory over Cork's Midleton College. This team has now graduated to under 16 level and are currently leading the Munster League.

The senior side, meanwhile, is busy preparing for that All-Ireland semi-final in February when they will face either Belfast, Galway or Tipperary town.

New members are welcome to join any of the club's teams. The senior team trains from 8.30 to 9.30pm on Tuesday nights at Rockwell.


ance, a first for the Club.


