'Party drug cocaine destroying **South Tipperary families'**

South Tipperary's "huge cocaine epidemic" has resulted in beatings, death threats and suicides, according to a local councillor.

Carrick-on-Suir councillor David Dunne said the rise of "party drug" cocaine is a "serious issue", while also stating that increased heroin use is a problem loc-

ally.
"It's out of hand at the moment. Anyone living in Clonmel and the surrounding areas will know what's going on - the death threats, the beatings, the suicides, the going after people who are dead and going after their families for money that they are owed. People are paying off drug debts, getting more drugs to sell and getting in more debt," he told councillors at the December meeting of Tipperary County Council in Clonmel.

The Sinn Féin councillor said all classes in society are taking "huge amounts of cocaine", highlighting that it has become "cheaper and more available" in recent times

"Unfortunately cocaine is starting to seep into part of our culture. You go into a pub and you can't get into a sitdown toilet in a men's toilet because there are two or three men in there and they are not in there for any other reason than to take drugs. You would want to be blind not to see what's going on."

Cllr Dunne said some people think they can take cocaine "recreationally at the weekend, but not everyone is able to do that". He added: 'It's destroying families, it's destroying lives and it's destroying children's lives because their parents are out of control on cocaine and other

"Cocaine is being mixed with different stuff to increase the strength of the drug. They cut it so much from the original stuff that comes into the country and you end up with rat poison and other stuffin it. There are people dying on our streets on a daily basis because of cocaine, committing suicide or from the drug itself."

'Bottles of whiskey for a tenner absolutely disgraceful'

The "serious issue" of alcohol being sold at a low price in County Tipperary was raised at the December meeting of Tipperary County **Council in Clonmel on** Monday.

Cllr Jim Ryan said that it's "outstanding" that bottles of whiskey can be bought for in supermarkets, councillors leading voicing their concerns on the county's drink and drug culture.

Cllr Ryan said it's "absolutely disgraceful" that alcohol is being sold at a loss, with "the seller making a profit on the VAT at the expense of the taxpayer" through a loophole which allows them to recover the VAT on the difference between the sale and cost price.

Cllr David Doran said "alcohol is cheaper than sweets and soft minerals". He recalled attending a recent family event in County Tipperary, witnessing teenagers out of their minds with drink".

Cllr Seamus Morris said pubs are being "cleaned out

cheap alcohol. He said "lots of pubs" will close down in the near future, citing "predrinking" as a "massive problem". Cllr Morris said it's frightening" the amount of alcohol being consumed at home, stating that there 'used to be some control drinking in the pub". He added: "We have a serious problem facing us with young people with liver problems in their 20s and 30s. We can bury our heads in the sand all we want but there is a lot of drinking going on that is not controlled."

Cllr Hughie McGrath said

away with blue murder", adding: "You can buy 24 cans for €20 and then come along with your voucher and get 20% off more cans. There are cans of cider for 50c and it needs to be challenged."

Mayor of the Clonmel Borough District Cllr Richie Molloy said the sale of cheap alcohol in supermarkets is a "huge problem", calling for more alternatives for young people to steer them away from drink.

Contributing to the debate on drinking at home instead of in the pub, Cllr Roger Kennedy highlighted that it's

our villages". He said a proposal has been put forward where the National Transport Authority will have to insist on making sure that Tipperary's towns and villages are covered every night of the week.

Cllr Catherine Carey said it's "embarrassing" watching drink-fuelled people spill onto the streets late at night, raising concerns for young women flagging down cars that they think are taxis because of Clonmel's lack of a taxi rank

Cllr John Crosse backed his colleague Cllr Phyll

Government rolling out a national camnaign highlighting dangers of alcohol and drug abuse.

Cllr Martin Browne, who has been selected to sit on the South East Regional Drug and Alcohol Task Force, also backed a proposal to write to the Government about the sale of cheap alcohol.

He called on society to change its attitude to drink, adding: "Adults are going out buying cheap drink for youngsters. We are all responsible and it starts in the

'It would take a minor miracle to get him home to Clonmel for Christmas but we have to hope'

A Clonmel family has issued a heartfelt plea to the Dubai rulers to allow their brother home for Christmas.

John White was released from prison in Dubai after over four years incarceration in August 2017, but is trapped in the country because his passport is being held by the authorities

"We would love him home for Christmas. He has not seen his children for years. It would take a minor miracle but we have to hope. It would be the most wonderful Christmas gift," his sister Eileen O'Brien told South Tipp Today.

A father of eight, the 63year-old businessman was imprisoned for the inability to pay his debts after the collapse of his construction business.

The White family in Clonmel is hopeful that a meeting between the rulers of Dubai with a delegation from Dáil Éireann will speed up the release of their brother from the country.

"It was the first official intervention, so we are very hopeful something will come from it," said Eileen.

A member of that trade delegation, Tipperary TD Mattie McGrath said the meeting was a very positive

"The mission availed of the opportunity to bring up the

case of John White. A letter from the Taoiseach was handed in relation to the case and great work is being done by the Irish ambassador over there," said Deputy McGrath.

"John is in good health now. He made a good recovery from a stroke over there and is in good spirits, but he would love to see his family again. John and all of the family are very grateful for helping him by supporting a Go Fund appeal," she added.



Record number of people on housing list in Cashel and Tipperary

Cashel and Tipperary town face a serious housing crisis unless something is done urgently, with a record number of 691 people on the housing waiting list.

There are proposals for 28 houses in Knockanrawley, Tipperary town, said housing official Sean Lonergan at a meeting of the Cashel/Tipperary municipal authority.

The plans will be submitted to the Department and be back within a month.

A 'masterplan' for Bansha is to be completed in two or

three weeks. The plan involves 12 houses for Bansha and "once done up, we'll send them off to the Department for approval."

Cllr Martin Browne expressed concern about the number of housing applicants on the list for the area. The figure is now around

"That figure is going up the whole time," he said. There were about 500 on the housing waiting list between the two major towns of Cashel and Tipperary, said Cllr Tom Wood.

"And not a single (Council) house built in Cashel for

many years. It will be a long time before we have one house built in Cashel."

The vast majority of those in social housing are in the HAP Scheme, which works with private providers and various supports.

"Because of property price increases, they (landowners) are now deciding they want to sell"

There is a fear that with houses being sold, people in HAP Scheme will have to move on but there is nowhere for them to move to. "I see people searching all over the town, at auctioneers, with the HAP Scheme. You have to source it (the property) yourself. We are in a crisis situation because so many people are deciding the price is good to sell. Where will we put all these people," asked Cllr Wood.

"I agree people don't know what the future holds," said

Cllr Michael Fitzgerald. "We badly need to start building houses and trying to improve it, but you cannot do miracles."

Cllr Denis Leahy said he had a "problem with the HAP Scheme" as it doesn't give security of tenure to tenants. Some 96 extra people had come into HAPS in the area in 2018, and the figures are getting "worse and worse." "The property market is beginning to work, particularly in Tipperary town."

However, "it does not augur well for a system looking to provide accommodation." Anti-social behaviour is also blighting people's lives. Cllr Leahy said he knew of one couple who had to listen to music blaring at 4 o'clock in the morning before getting up to work. "Who is implementing these regulations?" he asked.

Cllr Roger Kennedy said


Just 12 months ago, that figure was around 600. "People who don't qualify they have huge difficulties in sourcing private accommodation."

Cllr Kennedy called for a list of villages to be supplied where the Council owned land. This land could be zoned for housing, "to get housing built in those areas."

Cllr Martin Browne said the anti-social behaviour in some estates is "desperate" but there needs to be a "paper trail" to prove it, and it's "very hard for residents stuck in that situation".

Mr Lonergan said the 691 is a "spike on the list" and only appeared in the last few months. Tipperary Council has a record of success in offering social housing supports to applicants, and meeting its targets, said Mr Lonergan. In relation to anti-social behaviour, it was difficult to evict offenders as "we are dealing with people who are at most risk. If you evict them, they are back in as homeless

Marie Boland retires from Tipperary Library Service

"I can't remember two days in 42 years that I didn't want to go to work," fondly reflects Clonmel's Marie Boland following her recent retirement from Tipperary **County Council Library Ser-**

A native of Ennis, Marie was handed a copy of a local newspaper that included a job advert for a librarian with Clare County Council 42 years ago. "From week one I knew it was for me. There was so much more to it than just books and reading, even back in the 1970s. I just loved it," Marie tells South Tipp Today.

"There were activities such as story time and school riddles, along with local, national and international exhibitions in the library. There were no computers back then and it was just so enjoyable reading all sorts of books, encouraging kids to get into the habit of reading for 10 minutes a day. That was my mantra - 10 minutes a day and it becomes a habit that you will have for your whole life. I loved seeing children learn from books, and took great pleasure out of reading myself or listening to someone read in the library," Marie smiles.

Marie applied for a higher grade role at Thurles Library, where she spent six months before moving to a new library in Roscrea. She was then presented with "the chance of a lifetime", with the next chapter of her story journeying towards Clonmel.

"I enjoyed a very happy few years with warm people and had a great social life in Ro-

"We had a very progressive librarian, Martin Maher, who had big plans for a state-ofthe-art library in Clonmel and he asked me to open it in 1987. I spent a day crying because I loved Roscrea and was very happy there, but this was too big an opportunity to turn

"I arrived in Clonmel with just my bags, but from day one I felt at home because the group of us working in the library really gelled together. We were public servants and devoted to giving the people the best service. I grew to love Clonmel and it's my home now, except when it comes to GAA my heart will always be Clare," she laughs.

Married to Michael with two adult children, Marie has seen many changes in Tipperary County Council Library Service over the years, pinpointing the emergence of technology as "mind-boggling". She says: "Computers opened us up to a whole new world and a new way of

Take a gander at the new geese in Ardfinnan

A "family" in Ardfinnan, whose numbers had dwindled alarmingly in recent months, have been replaced by a new gaggle of their species.

Geese have been a constant presence on the village green for more than half a century or, as well-known local musician Stefan Grace puts it, "since Adam was a

In recent months Ardfinnan's geese population

stood at 12 and parish priest Fr. Pat Butler dubbed them

They were so much part of the fabric of life in Ardfinnan that there's a Geese Crossing sign at the side of the road running through the village, and traffic often came to a standstill to allow them pass.

However, they then began mysteriously vanish without trace, until just one

"The poor craythur was so lonely he nearly came into Mass with us," says Stefan.

"Everyone was brokenhearted and there was a cloud over the village."

Local people, determined that the birds wouldn't disappear from the village landscape, went about replacing

Mattie Bradshaw and Desmond Cunningham sourced geese for sale in Co. Galway and local councillor Michéal Anglim, his wife Margareth and Tommy Myles set off for Glenamaddy.

They returned with 13 geese, including one gander, which has been nicknamed Big Tom after the late country singer's famous hit Four Roads to Glenamaddy.

"They cost €20 each and donations from local people covered the cost," says Cllr.

Eleven are now settling

into their new home on the green and in the river while the remaining two have taken up residence on the lake at Marlhill, Ardfinnan.

"They are settling in and everyone is delighted and excited," says Stefan Grace.

With the festive season fast approaching, and people making preparations for Christmas dinner, Stefan said that locals would be keeping a close eye on the birds to make sure that they didn't come to any harm.

"People are more alert and will be looking out for them,"

Mother shares heartache of losing son to drunk driver on the road with Tipp students

A mother who lost her son to a car crash has opened up about her family's heartache.

Christina Donnelly's 26year-old son Brendan and his friend were killed by a drunk driver on the road.

Brendan, his friend and two women were heading off on a holiday when a drunk driver ploughed into them.

Christina shared her story with over 400 Tipperary secondary school students as part of a Road Safety Matters event, which was organised by Tipperary Fire and Rescue Service with the roads section of Tipperary County Council, the Gardai, HSE and the Road Safety Authority.

The students were given a shocking insight into the life-changing consequences irre-

sponsible driving can inflict on families.

"You could just feel and see the impact Christina had on the students. It was very powerful and moving to listen to her outline how the tragedy changed all of their lives forever," said Clonmel assistant chief fire officer Carol Kennedy.

Christina was one of many guest speakers at the Clonmel Park Hotel event. Throughout the day students from four Clonmel secondary schools and the secondary school in Fethard had the opportunity to use the Road Safety Authority rollover car, the shuttle bus simulator and witnessed a simulated road traffic accident with all the emergency services taking part.

Joe Fogarty and Sergiusz Wilkowski were the Pope John Paul II gold medal recipients and three students went to Calcutta with the Hope Foundation Immersion Project which was a life changing experience.

Some students got the opportunity to visit Seville, Gibraltar and Granada as well as a wonderful educational and cultural classical studies trip to Rome, while others opted to take on the gruelling physical challenges of the Camino and experience the spiritual rewards.

Physical activity plays a huge role in the school with opportunities to get involved in a vast array of team and individual sports.

WILD ABOUT SOUTH TIPP

December saw the kids and I standing by the large window in the kitchen.

It looks out onto a veritable jungle, by most people standards, but to us it is home to robins, wrens, butterflies and moths.

When I get bored with daytime TV, but yet don't feel the need to venture out, the view from the window keeps me in touch with nature.

I have a notebook in my hand, and this week the Birdwatch Ireland winter garden survey kicks off. This national citizen science project can be done from the comfort of your own kitchen or living

The survey can be done in any rural or suburban garden. I have a friend who records in the middle of a large town, and it is interesting to compare our results each year. He lives near river and sometimes gets birds that makes me a little envious. Herons, a swan and even a little egret have all graced his large lawn. In fairness I get redpolls, siskins and goldfinches - he never records these birds.

The form is very easy to fill in and it can also be done online. You answer a few basic questions about your garden.

Next comes the enjoyable piece. Each week you count the highest number of each species that visits your garden. Over the course of the winter, I find it builds up an accurate picture of numbers and species of birds found in my part of the country.

I also love watching how bird behaviour changes over the winter months. The normally territorial blackbirds have an uneasy truce. It always looks like hostility is about to break out, as they jostle for a piece of apple or guard their female from the attentions of another male. During really hard weather, I have often counted up to 11 blackbirds in my garden.

I also see small loose groups of blackbirds in the Tipperary town hills, along the base of a native hedgerow. During the summer they are spaced out along the hedgerows and in the trees, but hunger and survival brings them together in the winter.

The weather too impacts the variety of birds I see in the garden. After the first of the frosty nights has sent a chill through the house and the garden, the bird feeders are very busy in the morning. Hungry birds contest for their share of peanuts, seeds and apples. With natural food in short supply and only a few hours of daylight, birds need all the help we can give them to survive the long winter nights.

Keep feeding stations out in the open to avoid ambushing cats. Also good hygiene. Clean feeders and bird tables at least once a week, removing any old seeds.

Fruit like apples and grapes (cut in half) can be put out for thrushes. I have a beautiful male blackbird across the road from my house. Each morning he calls from under the willow tree and I throw across a slice of apple. Apples can also be hung form strings or stuck onto branches for acrobatic blue and great tit.

Peanuts are packed full of energy, but don't use the ones you drink with a beer. They are too salty, and also avoid



putting out crisps and biscuits. White bread fill birds up with empty calories. They can run out of energy to keep themselves warm during the long cold nights.

Nyger seeds are great for attracting goldfinches, get the kids cooking during the festive season and for making fat cakes for birds.

Growing native trees and shrubs like hawthorn, mountain ash and elderberry provide berries, and you might entice in a migrant redwing or fieldfare.

Water is also essential for drinking and bathing to keep feathers clean and water-proof. A raised bird bath is a great garden feature and provides hours of entertainment observing the birds.

Christmas in the Garden Wildlife Matters Taking a medical negligence case

The area of medical negligence deals with many sensitive and complex issues. Often people are not only facing the challenge of overcoming their ordeal, whether it be a misdiagnosis of an illness, a procedure that had complications or otherwise, they will now face a lengthy road to justice.

What is the difference between negligence and a mistake?

There are risks to every procedure. However, negligence is said to occur when the standard of care drops below what is an acceptable standard. This includes misreading of scans, a delayed or misdiagnosis among others. Negligence is also considered to be an act that another person of the same profession would not have done.

The Statute of Limitations

The first step in establishing whether there is a viable case is to look at the Statute of Limitations. Under the Statute of Limitations, a person has two years from the date the negligent event occurred to commence proceedings. However, it is quite possible that someone may not know that they have been subject to negligence, for example, they may not notice any symptoms for some time after the event. In this case, a person may rely on the Knowledge Principle. This principle states that you have two years from the date you knew or ought to have known that

negligence occurred. This provides a fair timeframe for both the plaintiff and defendant. It means that someone cannot take an action many years after it occurred but also allows enough time for the effect of a negligent event to be no-

Expert opinion

The next step after meeting with a solicitor, is to gather all medical records and commence a review to establish if negligence has occurred and at what point in treatment did it occur. This is a vital step as it determines whether a case should be brought or not. A solicitor is then obliged by law to obtain a medical report from a suitable expert to support a case of medical negligence. This expert must have the same qualifications as the person you are taking a case against in order to determine what a professional should have done in the same situation. Only then can a case of negligence be identified and the process can begin. It is im-

to remember however, that a solicitor would have good knowledge of the law and be able to identify if there is a viable case in advance of obtaining a

If there is a group of people with the same complaint, each case will stand on its own merit. In Ireland, no class action occurs. There is often a 'test' case which has already been decided and the court will usually refer to that but each case must be worked on individually.

The crucial point to remember in medical negligence is that a complaint must be taken within the relevant time period. Only then can a case progress.

Struggling people targeted by moneylenders

Tippperary people struggling to cope are being pushed into dealing with the moneylenders, according to the president of St Vincent de Paul.

Clonmel's Kieran Stafford has slammed the Central Bank and the Government for "rolling out the red carpet" to moneylenders whose exorbitant interest rates inflict huge misery and turmoil on families.

Kieran said Christmas was one of the biggest trigger points for families to turn to moneylenders and he appealed to people considering that option to go to the Credit Union or St Vincent de Paul first.

He hit out at the Central Bank and the Government for their role in allowing moneylenders exploit so many people.

Kieran, who is frustrated by the decision of the Central Bank to allow another moneylender into the Irish market and by the failure of the Government to cap interest rates, said people all over the country who are struggling to cope and are being pushed into dealing with the moneylenders.

"The Central Bank and the Government are making it easier for moneylenders to inflict misery on families. It is scandalous," he said following the decision of the Central Bank to allow another moneylender, Amigo, into the Irish market.

"The Government is giving free rein to moneylenders unless they cap interest rates. The moneylenders are charging exorbitant interest rates to people who are in real difficulty. It costs the poor more for everything and the same applies to credit."

He said there were 330,000 people in Ireland going to one of the 39 moneylenders here. "Moneylenders are booming, and now we have another one in Ireland.

"People are going without food to enable their children

to eat and to allow them pay the rent because the biggest fear is eviction," said Kieran.

Christmas is a time when people are most vulnerable. People struggling to pay bills, he said, were sent into a crisis by the arrival of an event such as a communion, a birthday or the need to buy a major household appliance.

"Any event outside of the normal costs sends people into great difficulty and that is when they feel they have no option but to go to the moneylender, which creates even bigger problems for the family," Kieran added.

Christmas comes early for Credit Union members

There was good news in the last week for members of Clonmel Credit Union.

The credit union's annual general meeting at the Clonmel Park Hotel approved an interest rebate of some 30% for those members who had taken out loans.

This amounted to a total payment of €2.1 million, an average of €271 per borrower.

"That's money that's going directly into the local economy and will be spent locally this Christmas," says CEO of Clonmel Credit Union Padraig Enright.

Most credit unions pay an interest rebate of between 5-7% so this was great news for members of Clonmel Credit Union, which is one of the largest community-based credit unions in the country.

The credit union has

The credit union has 27,000 members who live or work in the greater Clonmel area as well as Fethard, Mullinahone, Cloneen and Drangan.

Last year Clonmel Credit Union made 8,000 loans, amounting to ϵ_7 million, available to members.

"That's an average of 35

loans a day

"We approved 98% of all loan applications, most of which were approved within 24-36 hours, and many on the same day," he says.

These included loans for home improvements, car purchase, education costs, holidays, Christmas and seasonal events including First Holy Communions and Confirmations.

Clonmel Credit Union has €60 million outstanding in loans to members.

It has €155 million in members' shares, or savings.

Those savings grew by €10 million last year.

In another sign of the local credit union's robust good health, it made a surplus of €4 million this year.

€2.1 million was returned to members in the interest rebate, while the remainder was directed to credit union reserves to strengthen its financial base and secure its future.

Ten per cent of Clonmel Credit Union's business is now conducted online, including loan applications, with futher investment planned for online services for the convenience of memhers

There are also plans to refurbish Credit Union House in Parnell Street, Clonmel to provide members with better services.

Clonmel Credit Union has late opening on Thursday evening and its offices are also open all day Saturday.

It employs 37 full-time and part-time staff, all of whom are local people; and it provides sponsorship for several local clubs and organisations.

Credit unions generally received the number one customer-experience scores in the country for the fifth year in-a-row this year.

Hailing originally from Athea in West Limerick, Padraig Enright has worked in financial services for the past 32 years.

He served as Bank of Ireland's regional manager in the south east, when he was based in Kilkenny.

He also ran KBC Bank's regional network, and also did project work for that bank in the Belgian city of Leuven.

Fraudsters scam alert issued by Tipp gardaí

Fraudsters have conned a small business and two people from County Tipperary out of thousands of euros through email and phone scams in recent weeks.

Gardaí are investigating the scams that occurred over the past seven weeks and have appealed to businesses and people to be wary of emails and phone calls requesting you to give bank account details and personal information.

Garda Insp. James White said the three fraud incidents they are investigating were similar yet different in each case.

One case involves a small business that received an email purporting to be from their bank outlining changes and requesting bank account details from the firm. The information was then used by the scammer to fraudulently take money from their bank account.

In another case, a fraudster rang up a person in County Tipperary pretending to be from the Revenue Commissioners. The caller claimed they were entitled to a tax rebate and requested their bank account details so the rebate could be paid to them. When the bank information was given, money was taken from the

person's account soon after.

The third County Tipperary fraud case also involved a phone call. This time a person received a call purporting to be from a telecommunications company contacting them about improving their slow broadband speed. The person was asked to turn on their computer so the broadband speed could be checked. The fraudster guided the unsuspecting person through a number of

steps on their computer that allowed the criminals to gain access to the computer and obtain the owner's bank account details. It resulted in money being stolen from their account.

Insp. White appealed to Tipperary businesses and people to be very wary of phone calls and emails they receive, and urged people to alert elderly relatives and friends of the scam.

And he advised that in the

event you give out details to one of these scammers and realise something is wrong, immediately alert your bank and get your accounts frozen and contact the gardai.

He said money is taken

He said money is taken very quickly from people's bank accounts, transferred initially to an Irish based account and then transferred outside the jurisdiction. The quicker you can act the better your chances of stopping the fraud or getting your money back, he said.

extended thanks to the brilliance of Browne slotting three vital points, two from play. The see-saw pattern did not end there however as Rice College once again raised a green flag.


The Cashel men would be really put to the pin of their collar when their lead was cut to two through two further points, leaving the score 2-13
